Degree colleges affiliated to Mumbai varsity begin new academic year via online mode

UG, PG courses for MU-affiliated colleges will be conducted online

Mumbai: The degree colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai (MU) began the new academic year 2021-22 on Tuesday for second and third year Undergraduate (UG) and second year Postgraduate (PG) programmes by starting regular lectures via online mode. Professors are conducting online lectures from home as they are not permitted to commute by suburban train in Mumbai due to the Covid-19 lockdown restrictions.



MU released a circular on Monday stating, "Principals of all affiliated colleges, directors of recognised institutions, university sub-campus at Thane and Ratnagiri and heads of university departments are hereby informed that the new academic year 2021-22 will commence with effect from June 14, 2021. The lectures of Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes except for the first year/first part will begin on online platform after the completion of the admission process."

Following this direction, degree colleges started regular online lectures from Tuesday. Anushree Lokur, principal of Ramnarain Ruia College, Matunga, said, "We began regular lectures via online mode starting from Tuesday."

Pooja Ramchandani, in-charge principal of HR College, Churchgate, said, "We have started online lectures for second and third year students of all UG courses. Professors are not permitted to commute by local train so our teaching staff is working from home. We have not received any guidelines from MU regarding calling professors to work from college campus."

Baliram Gaikwad, in-charge Registrar of MU said, "We have informed all affiliated degree colleges to start the academic year via online platforms completely. The Maharashtra state government has not given permission for college teachers to commute by suburban train services so professors can continue to work and conduct lectures remotely."

Over the last year and a half, we have witnessed an unprecedented global crisis that threatens to plunge our known world into the depths of the unknown. This has been the year of the pandemic. Nothing will ever be the same again. To think that a whole year has gone by without physical encounters of everyday life, without teachers meeting students in classroom, without students meeting their classmates, family and friends gone forever without saying goodbye are now no longer something out of science fiction or a dystopian film. This is our new reality. We have been compelled to encounter it, wrestle with it, struggle to interpret it and come to terms with it. As we move through the portal of the pandemic, we are hopeful that we may, if we are humble enough, be able to come out of it as more humane, more sensitive and more loving than what we have been before this humanitarian crisis exploded in our face.

Our academic lives have undergone radical transformation. This year we moved on from physical teaching-learning to online platforms. Zoom and Google Meet took over from college campus and classrooms. Some of our students will do well as they have the wherewithal to handle e-learning, but what about those who are poor, or those in rural areas with no electricity, limited internet, the

socially disadvantaged learners who will fall off the grid into a pit of darkness and despair? These issues shall remain at the forefront of our concerns as we move through another year of closure and distance.

We must continue to provide service not only to our own students but extend our ministrations to those who are struggling to stay afloat. There have been many projects that our college teachers and students have undertaken to help bridge this digital divide, bring the classroom into our homes, ensure that our learners continue with their studies and broaden their horizons by organising programmes that go beyond the syllabus and address the potential for holistic and sustainable development.

Epidemics have been part of human history and have always played a transformative role. The ruthless propaganda for growth and constant preoccupation with productivity, rapacious need for ceaseless consumption, obsession with narcissistic accumulation have led to the plundering and devastation of people and the environment. The pandemic is an ongoing apocalypse; it has shown us the fragility of human life and the trauma of grief and despair. It has also stood as witness to the social transformation and economic disruption of our times and tested the limits of modernity. The pandemic has exposed the boundaries of scientific knowledge and made us acutely aware of the inscrutability and uncertainty of human life. Historically, pandemics have forced humans to break from the past and re-imagine their world. Thus, if we have to heal as a civilization, post-pandemic life must take into account the cathartic and ecstatic power of love, it is only through love that we will be able to move out of the portal leaving behind the old world of greed, violence, and loneliness into the light of humility, respect and spontaneity of human relationships. This one-day webinar, the first major programme organized by the HSNC University, after its inception, witnessed participation of more than 400 delegates from various colleges in India and abroad. Hosted by the Internal Quality Assurance Cells (IQAC) of HR College of Commerce & Economics and Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics, was held under the guidance of Dr. Vijay Joshi, Chief consultant at RUSA and Dr. Pramod N. Pabrekar, Senior consultant at RUSA.

Dr. Pooja Ramchandani, I/C Principal, HR College, in her welcome speech, spelt out the objective of the webinar as setting of institutional standards for obtaining higher grades at NAAC while Mr. Kishu Mansukhani, President of HSNC Board, articulated the objective of setting up HSNC University in alignment of the curriculum with the needs of the industry. He pointed out the new Yoga and vocation based courses started by various institutions under HSNC Board in keeping with this aim.

Mr. Vijay Joshi, the Chief consultant at RUSA, emphasized the responsibility that came with the status of being the first Cluster University in the country and the significance of being a trend setter in the field of education. He also spoke about the need for establishing

certain checks and balances for ensuring quality in education, for rewarding excellence and for imbibing quality culture in education.

In his inspiring address, Dr. CA Niranjani Hiranandani, Provost, HSNC University, called attention to the need for bringing about a paradigm change in education as well as the importance of devising syllabus aligned with the requirements of industry. He stressed on the necessity of up skilling through a process of unlearning, relearning and up learning in educational institutions in order to ensure that, students develop employability skills. India, he said, could become the next education centre of the world, with teachers playing a leading role in it.

The first technical session, piloted by Dr. Vani Laturkar, Senior Professor and Head-Management, School of Commerce and Management Sciences, Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded; focussed on the new NAAC parameters and the methods of inculcating quality systems in institutions. Dr. Laturkar explained the vision for NAAC process in terms of quality enhancement, self-evaluation, sustenance, initiation and promotion of a culture of quality enhancement. Institutional accreditation under NAAC, she explicated, was

basic for its survival and growth and further for acquiring various grants, starting new courses and programmes and obtaining autonomous status. Participants were apprised about the changes the process of NAAC has undergone with the emphasis having shifted from subjective to objective, offline to online, qualitative to quantitative, college centric to student centric as well as ICT based functioning and system generated scores. She also highlighted the new concepts of third party validation of data and importance of Student Satisfaction Survey (SSR). The process of accreditation with key indicators, strictures relating to data deviations, criteria wise weightages were also elaborated.

The second technical session conducted by Dr. Bhole, retired Associate Professor and Head, Department of Microbiology, Abasaheb Garware College, Pune, centred on the role of IQAC in the assessment and accreditation process. Hailing the IQAC as the think tank of an educational institution, he stressed upon its role in developing quality systems, quality enhancement and quality sustenance. He brought out the importance of preparing a perspective plan for the next 5 to 10 years as part of the goal setting initiative of an institution, to be conveyed to all stakeholders and development of systems for self-assessment involving feedback and SSR. He also pointed out the need for identifying key performance indicators in the process of setting benchmarks. Decisions as to what to benchmark, who to benchmark, data collection and analysis, gap analysis and gap filling were also identified as essential responsibilities of IQAC.

The third and the last technical session, on Documentation for NAAC, was conducted by Prof. C.N. Rawal, Principal Brihan Maharashtra College of Commerce. In his talk, centred on the novelties introduced in documentation, he identified authenticity, objectivity, transparency and credibility of data as the key principles of documentation. The mode of document submission, data exposition as well as data creation, were enumerated by him in great detail. Lastly, he explained exhaustively the documents that would need to be uploaded criteria-wise.


The Q/A session was moderated by Mr. Mani Iyer, Vice Principal, Smt. MMK College, following Ms Geeta Sahu's request questions which were posted in the chat box, were answered at the end of the session. To questions related are the various funding available for research from various agencies, Dr. Vani Laturkar explained the three types of funding agencies in existence; these being UGC and ICSSR. She further explained that apart from these two funding agencies, few industrial houses also provide funding. The difference between government funding and industrial funding was further elaborated by her. CSR funding provided by companies could also help enhance the image of educational institution. Principal Joshi pointed out that national research funding agency would be established in future and that its budget would 20,000 Crores per year. This funding would be provided for science, social science, commerce and humanities.



On the questions related to Green Initiatives Dr. Laturkar added that these related to the institutions i.e. whether they are attempting to keep their environment clean via measures such as no vehicle day, paper shredders for waste paper generated, recycling and so on. She explained that Green audit is concerned with all the practices that help towards an eco-friendly and pollution free environment. Dr. Bhole as well as Dr. Joshi also added few noteworthy points. Dr. Rawal pointed out ideas like reusing water, reduction of electricity, plastic free campus and car-pooling which will help to sustain the campus as well as the community.

Ms. Chippy Susan Bobby, IQAC Coordinator, MMK College and rapporteur of the entire session, summarized the highlights of the webinar. Beginning with a quote of William Shakespeare, she pointed out how the HSNC Board has been organising various webinars and lectures during this pandemic. She praised Dr. Joshi for his insights in the field of education as also Dr. Vani Laturkar for highlighting the need to look at new NAAC parameters and their functioning. She congratulated Dr. Bhole for explaining the fundamental roles of IQAC, which he identified as quality control and quality assurance. Terming the IQAC as a think-tank he challenged the participants to think out of the box. Dr. Rawal was thanked for giving a wonderful explanation on the documentation process for NAAC, which he explained, has changed. There is, he declared, greater emphasis on the data provided. A dynamic college website is yet another need of the times.

Prof. Dinesh Panjwani, Vice Chancellor of the HSNC

University, thanked RUSA for inviting him. He applauded the initiative taken by HR College and Smt. MMK College in conducting the webinar, the massive participation in the current one as well as the willingness of the HSNC University to associate with programmes involving improvement of quality standards in educational institutions. He pointed out the need for documentation, given that 70% assessment carried out today is online. NAAC, he reiterated is a prerequisite, since it gives an opportunity to institutions to learn from one another. He further explicated the need for autonomy in the field of education. Admiring the NAAC as a learning platform he declared that the identity of any college and its teachers is associated with it. Hence he put emphasis on a preparation strategy for NAAC along with personal discipline.

The webinar concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Dr. CA. Kishore S. Peshori, I/C Principal, Smt. MMK College of Commerce and Economics.

At the end feedback was collected which was analysed. Participants included 75% of the teaching staff and rest 25% were Principals and non-teaching staff. Approximately 80% of the participants highly rated all the resource persons as "Excellent". Considering the usefulness of the webinar, 82% of participants rated the webinar at "5" on the scale of 5 and all the participants felt it most informative and relevant. Indeed it was both fruitful and engaging, with the resource persons providing vital information regarding quality improvement measures for our educational institutions and their maintenance according to the new parameters set by NAAC.

WHICH COUNTRIES WILL EMERGE AS WINNERS POST COVID?

Dr. Tushar Poddar currently a Macro-Strategist, Wellington Fund Management; was an economist at the International Monetary Fund based out of Washington, DC for five years covering Emerging Markets and providing policy advice. Dr. Poddar earned a Ph.D and MSc in Economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

Summary: The program commenced with Dr. Tusshar Poddar discussing the current scenario of the world and the changes taking place due to the PANDEMIC. He explained in detail about the statistics on the impact of the pandemic in different countries. According to the statistics, countries like Vietnam and China have a very low mortality rate when compared with other countries. H.R. College is now a unit of **Lifelong Learning & Extension** in affiliation with the University of Mumbai where students of Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) (a project taken up by the students of the Research Cell) undertake various projects based on research, community level activities etc. The ultimate aim of the cell is to bring about positive transformation in society through knowledge creation, knowledge production and knowledge distribution.

Colleges affiliated with the university have to appoint their Student Managers who organise and conduct several activities as part of different projects, which is regarded as extension work for the enrolled students and report about the same to the university.

The department organizes a few training and networking sessions, various sessions of project presentations as well as question-answer sessions of the project work done by the students. DLLE also has its Annual Festival named Udaan, where students from different colleges of Mumbai showcase their talent and address contemporary social issues and concerns.

Students are awarded additional 10 marks to their overall semester score/GPA when they enrol into DLLE as upon completing a certain number of allotted hours of extension work, both - indoors and outdoors. The Honours Programme is a supplementary programme for academically gifted students. Thirty students are selected through a rigorous process. The college enrolls students who are immensely motivated and demonstrate passion for learning. The current Honours batch initiated *Vidhyadhanya*, where those students whose education was affected by the pandemic were taught through short educational content created and curated by Honours students.

FY - CASE STUDY PRESENTATION

Creativity and innovation are often considered the crux of entrepreneurship. The First Year students of the Honours Programme were tasked with a case study presentation. Students studied the challenges that Indian citizens faced in the field of entrepreneurship and analysed how various industries were incentivised to find solutions that could benefit society. Several corporations, start-ups, and life changing businesses were studied. What Customers Want

It's not just startups that have to worry about this. I think most businesses that fail do it because they don't give customers what they want. Look at restaurants. To make all this happen, you're going to need money. Some startups have been self-funding-- Microsoft for example-- but most aren't. I think it's wise to take money from investors. To be self-funding, you have to start as a consulting company, and it's hard to switch from that to a product company.

Duo Lingo

Duolingo's Advice for a Successful UGC Program:

1. Understand that different members will be interested in contributing at different levels of commitment, so build in multiple ways to contribute
2. You can keep the quality of user-generated content high by ensuring there's a strong leader providing guidance, and creating a sense of community so members feel committed to the group
3. Never ask members to do *too* much. Let them focus on the content and remove as many technological barriers as possible
4. When working with a community comprised of very different groups (ie. language barriers) a good approach is to break those groups out into their own sub-communities so they feel comfortable and connected
5. To keep contributors engaged, create cooperative rewards, or rewards that incentivize the group as a whole rather than just individuals. You can also create competition between groups, creating stronger ties within each group as they'll feel more like a team
6. When trying to incentivize your community members to contribute, focus on intrinsic incentives as they'll have the biggest impact.



LIBRARY REPORT

The year 2020-21 will be marked as an unique year as it halted the entire world due to a pandemic scenario caused by the novel Corona virus. From March 16, 2020 almost all educational institutes in Mumbai closed their onsite operations including libraries. As a result the HR Library modified its services to match with the varied needs of its clientele. Due to lockdown, though book purchase was at halt, the library continued to renew its journals via online mode to avoid break in volumes.

ACCESS TO OPEN ONLINE RESOURCES:

The library does subscribe various e-resources such as NList, JGate, IDI, General Reading Database. In addition to these databases, the library uploaded a list of various online open resources which students can use on the college website. It includes websites gives access to research journals, books, thesis, online courses and government recommended educational sites.

PREPAREDNESS OF FACULTY MEMBERS:

For Teachers also switching to completely online teaching learning mode was a challenge. To facilitate the process the library organised a series of training sessions with the help of recognised technology providers such as

- A session on “Effective use of New Age Technology Products for Education and Training” was conducted by experts from Informatics Limited on April 29, 2020.
- A session on “How to implement and use online teaching modes such as Google Handout and Google Classroom” was organized by NIIT: skills and talent Development Corporation on May 12, 2020.
- A session on “How to implement

and use online teaching modes such as Cisco Webex and YouTube Streaming” was organized by NIIT: skills and talent Development Corporation on May 15, 2020.

These sessions equipped the teachers to easily adapt required platform for online teaching learning requirements, hence were highly appreciated by all the college stakeholders. Problem solving and troubleshooting follow-ups were provided as per the need.

DATA CURATION:

As during the lockdown the print copies of study material were unavailable for students and faculty members, the library carried out Data curation for suitable study material from available open resources. It is made available to the users on need basis.

TRAINING VIDEOS ON DEMAND:

On demand of teachers special training videos were created and distributed on “How to type Hindi in Microsoft” and “How to create a talking power point”. Later the same were posted on Youtube for future access.

CAS & SDI

The library provided Current Awareness service and Selective dissemination of Information via telephone, what's app and emails. Reference service, access to online resources was offered with the help of Publishers. Online newspapers, question banks, books, journal articles were made accessible to the stakeholders.

BOOK BANK AND ISSUE OF PRINT COPIES

When lockdown was released the library allowed the students to issue book bank



sets and addition library books for study and recreational purpose. The regular rules of library such as limited books for limited days, overdue fines were relaxed keeping in mind the need of the time, Personalized guidance was offered to students about what to refer and how to access the same via telecon, email and whats app.

LIBRARY EXHIBITION:

As an annual event this year also the Library organised online book exhibition from March 6-9, 2020.

DAY CELEBRATIONS:

As every year the library celebrated various days such as Vachan Prerana Day, Marathi Bhasha Diwas, etc. Interactive Book displays were created and distributed to the library users on these days where users can read the displayed books by clicking on book picture of their choice.


A special Cell has been set up with an objective of providing a structured assistance for achieving academic excellence and personal success for students with Dyslexia and other educational needs.

JUNIOR COLLEGE

The teacher coordinator Ms. Shilpa Deshpande along with the Vice Principal, Ms. Laju Sharma, personally guided the SYJC students with Learning Disabilities as regards improving their academic performance. Students were given information about the extended exam facilities prescribed by the Maharashtra Board. The College assisted students by providing them with writers for their HSC Examination. The special guidance lectures in the subject of Co-operation were conducted from 25th February to 5th March, 2021.

FYJC - TOTAL STUDENTS - 37

The teacher Coordinator, Ms. Shilpa Deshpande organised and arranged the first FYJC Special Cell students parent meeting on February 26, 2021 with the Vice Principal Ms. Laju Sharma. The Vice Principal asked Ms. Sheela Yadav and Ms. Amrita Kampli to assist Ms. Shilpa Deshpande for the Special Cell activities from the current academic year.

Students and their parents were informed by Ms. Shilpa and the Vice Principal, Ms. Laju Sharma about the various practices adopted by the college to help students with learning disabilities overcome their difficulties, explore their talents and realize their full potential during their vital formative years. Students

and parents who could not speak in front of other parents and students about their issues were asked by the teacher coordinator to approach for the individual counselling with the Vice Principal and the teacher coordinators after the meeting. Ms. Laju Sharma along with the teacher coordinators guided students to improve their academic performance and other issues of general interest and relevance. The special guidance lectures in the subject of Co-operation were conducted from April 7 to May 14, 2021.

Special Social Initiative by Vice Principal Ms. Laju Sharma, for SYJC Special Cell Students

Every year the HR College assists its own students with Learning Disabilities by providing them with writers for writing their HSC examination. This year, 2020-21, due to ongoing pandemic situation it was becoming difficult for the differently-abled students of HR Junior College to get writers for writing their HSC Board Exam 2021. The Special Cell and the Vice-Principal were receiving requests for writers from our own SYJC special cell students due for appearing HSC Exam 2021. 



EXCEL IN MS-EXCEL


January 25, 2021

The webinar commenced with the speaker **Mr. Venkata Sri Harsha** explaining the meaning of shares, the history of share markets and stock exchanges in India and thus gave a basic level understanding of the share market for beginners. He is a macroeconomics enthusiast with an MBA in Marketing & Finance field, founder and managing director of Shine Projects, an educational company incorporated 4 years back recognised by the government of India, operating from the t-hub in Telangana.

The webinar then took a practical approach wherein the use of a demat account for buying shares was demonstrated by the speaker. The students were then introduced to the interface of the money control app which can prove very useful for investing in the stock market.

The speaker further explained the difference between an investor and a trader and threw light on the importance of technical analysis for all stock traders. The students were introduced to the various tools used in technical analysis. The candlestick pattern, an important tool for stock trading, were expounded in a simple manner and its applicability was illustrated using multiple real life examples.

The webinar ended with a Q & A session wherein the speaker addressed all the queries of the students, encouraging them to invest in the stock market and learn more through practice.

AN OVERVIEW OF FINANCIAL MARKETS

August 12, 2020

The Self - Finance Department organized a Webinar by Mr. Kunal Rambhia, founder and Fund Manager, The Streets, who manages a hedge fund of INR 60 crores. He has been managing the fund for the past four years and provided a return of 103% Y-o-Y basis. There were 197 participants who attended the session across all the self-finance courses.

At the outset, he showed the students the performance and trends of Sensex 30 since its inception. He then explained the importance of hedging their investments in order to make sure that they keep their risk limited. He explained the correlation between different indices and the GDP, and showed the chart on negative correlation between Nifty 50 and Small Cap Companies recently. He expects the Nifty 50 to correct and align itself with the Small Caps. He also told them about how he made a return of 29% in less than a month by going long on Silver.

He spoke about the P/E ratio of Nifty 50 and showed them its past trends with the help of info-graphics. He concluded that the current P/E ratio of Nifty 50 is at a lifetime high of 30.65 and they are most likely to see the bears taking over from here.

STARTING YOUR INVESTING JOURNEY

March 5, 2021

The BFM Committee of H.R. College organized a session with esteemed speaker Ms. Shreemoyee Mukhopadhyaya, an HR alumnus and ex-RBI associate, who is also in the process of getting her degree from the Wharton School of Pennsylvania. She has set up her own wealth management business and has worked previously with HR College as an advisor for various initiatives.

Ms. Shreemoyee highlighted the importance of investing, not just for the creation of wealth, but to ensure that time and inflation do not erode your



wealth. She delved into the basics like mutual funds and SIP's, exchange traded funds and debt funds etc.

She advised the students to use brokerage platforms like Zerodha, HDFC etc. She emphasized on doing extensive research by using sites like investing.com, Wall Street Journal, Capital Market etc. She recommended sites like Zerodha Varsity and NSE Learning as places to get certificate courses that would equip you with the necessary skills to become a great investor.


E - INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO JAIN FARM FRESH FOODS LTD.

He stressed on the importance of digitization in the hotel



Mumkin: the AI-based app chose HR College to launch its first outreach programme creating awareness about female genital cutting and the impact of mutilation on the female body and female psyche. Mumkin, is a free, Artificial Intelligence-driven app for enabling difficult conversations.

Mumkin is founded by Priya Goswami and Aarefa Johari who have nine years of experience of creating conversation on Female Genital Cutting in India. Priya Goswami is a National Award-winning documentary filmmaker and a communication designer. In 2015, she co-founded Sahiyo, an international non-profit based in Mumbai and Boston. She is also the co-founder, creative head and CEO of Mumkin. Aarefa Johari is a journalist, feminist and aspiring violinist. She divides her time between working as a senior reporter for Scroll.in, and advocating for an end to the practice of Female Genital Cutting or FGC.

The programme addressed the harmful cultural norm of Female Genital Cutting and shed light on its prevalence in India. As communication designers on the subject, their endeavour was to highlight the role played by language in effective and sensitive communication and show how to use language as an ally. They also discussed various multimedia tools such as films, graphics and launched the Artificial Intelligence-driven app, co-created by them, to further the advocacy work on the subject.

The programme saw a huge turnout and students enthusiastically participated in asking questions. Many doubts were cleared and a lot of difficult conversations around female body, pain, trauma and mental health took place. The programme ended with participants realising how there are safe spaces where difficult conversations are made possible and technology can become an aid to people who are struggling with mental health issues.

ALUMNI LECTURE WITH THE FOUNDERS OF BOMBAY HEMP COMPANY


October 24, 2020

The two successful alumni, the founders of Bombay Hemp Company – Mr. Jahan Peston Jamas, Co-founder and Director, Strategy & Investor Relations and Mr. Chirag Tekchandaney, Co-founder and CEO; guided the budding entrepreneurs of H.R. College on how their college learning's helped them in building a massive company. The alumni also focused on strategies they used to turn around the stigma of cannabis and how beneficial cannabis is in the field of textile, automobiles, and medicines.

The speakers shared their journey of “How their college learnings helped them to build Boheco,” with the students. They got the idea of setting up a company that was centered around using hemp, which is the industry variant of cannabis during their visit to the rural areas of India. Their main objective behind setting up Boheco was to change the perception of cannabis and make the industry benefits of hemp known to the general public.

In order to change the perception of the public, they undertook a lot of research, which also caught the eye of Mr. Ratan Tata, and they consequently received funding from Mr. Tata for the same. They also worked closely with seven state governments to facilitate the growth of cannabis for industrial purposes. One of the main strategies adopted by them was using a logo that helped reinvent the image of cannabis.

The speakers guided students through their journey of nurturing their idea and getting ahead of the others by starting at an early age, right from their college days. They motivated the students to have a never-give-up attitude in life. Their journey also encouraged students to believe in their passion and to take risks in order to reach the pinnacle of success.



GOING BEYOND THE DEGREE

October 31, 2020

Two other alumni Mr. Anirudh Agarwal and Ms. Priyanshi Chokshi were invited to share the learnings that helped to set up their venture “Beyond the Degree”.

The speakers, both chartered accountants, decided to use their knowledge of various professions to encourage students to pursue unconventional choices in the field of entrepreneurship. Both alumni emphasized on the fact that no one is born as an entrepreneur, but what distinguishes an entrepreneur from the others is their passion and dedication.

They shared with students their experiences in college and how the numerous opportunities of participating in committees along with academic activities, taught them valuable lessons in time management and goal alignment. They also showed the several aspects of the entrepreneurial journey right from ideation to implementation, and shared with students the Do's and Don'ts of a startup. Our speakers also bust popular myths that are associated with the entrepreneurial journey, and motivated us to put our best foot forward. This event had active participation of around 100 attendees.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP AS A HABIT

November 7, 2020

The E-Cell conducted its third session of the Alumni Lecture Series with Mr. Abhinav Ravi, a senior executive of restructuring services international at Deloitte Global FA. The topic for the lecture was “Entrepreneurship as a Habit”.

Mr. Abhinav shared his knowledge on wealth creation, money management, and savings. He focussed on the wonders of compound interest and investing at an early age. He also encouraged the students to consider the time value of money while taking important decisions. Focusing on how entrepreneurship can be instilled as a habit amongst students, he said that entrepreneurship is more about mind set and providing value rather than its traditional definition as a startup or merely a business.

He touched upon important topics such as public speak-

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS


May 7, 2021

The E-Cell conducted a webinar on Intellectual Property Rights with guest speaker Adv. Gitika Khanchandani, who is the founder and principal attorney at GNK Legal.

Ms. Gitika commenced the webinar by highlighting the need and relevance of Intellectual Property Rights in the current digital scenario. She highlighted the lesser-known differences between patents, trademarks, copyrights and industrial designs. Once these differences had been established, she explained a variety of interesting case laws, which gave the attendees a clear picture about the topic.

The speaker then explained the key elements involved in intellectual property rights such as unconventional trademarks, copyrights and copyright disputes in depth. The speaker explained the various categories of trademarks along with a variety of examples. She explained the parameters involved in obtaining copyrights such as ambit of copyrights, copyright disputes and copyright enforcement. The speaker also touched upon the mandates for designing products under the design act.

Ms. Gitika's parting advice to the budding entrepreneurs was to comply with the IPR regulations right from the inception stage of their start-up. The session was highly interactive with numerous queries from the audience. The event witnessed the active participation of 40 attendees.

6S OF START-UPS

May 22, 2021

The Entrepreneurship and Incubation Cell conducted a session on "The 6S of start-ups" with Ms. Ananya Banerjee. She is a lawyer, problem solver, author and an entrepreneur.

Ms. Ananya Banerjee conducted an insightful session was on zoom, explaining the 6S of start-ups - sort, set in order, shine, standardize, sustain, and success. She explained each and every component in detail to the students. The sort component involves sorting tasks, office equipment, human resources and talent, and skills of the employees by creating a database.

She further explained how equipment must be set in order according to their usage, and the organisation must align its expenditure according to its strategy. The next phase - shine, involves improving process efficiency and reducing wastage.

Once the business is optimised, the start-up owner must standardize routine areas such as onboarding and human resource which will enable the business to become sustainable in the long run. The final stage involves defining key performance indicators in each areas of the organisation to measure and evaluate the success.

She also quoted that "A startup should run successfully for first 1000 days" which means the first 1000 days are difficult for a startup but once these days are over a startup will run successfully. It was an interactive session where students gained an overview on implementing the 6S framework in an organisation.

- Ensure continuous flow of knowledge in your team – both ways so the employees and the executives both understand what is happening.
 - If something is not working – do not try to mend it – do a cause-and-effect analysis and work on the cause to solve the effect.
 - Work with the framework continuously to make it a part of your operational framework.
 - Involve your team.
 - Ask and create an environment in your organisation where others can ask – questions.
 - Keep the inspections friendly, and yet, effective.
 - Use visual dashboards (if possible) to share the KPI data with the relevant party.

August 24, 2020



- To align one's personality with the goals one aspires to achieve





1. Positive Posters - A Digital Poster Making Competition




2. 'Expressive Art therapy' Session with Dr. Fatema Slatewala




COFFEE GROUNDS BY TATA STARBUCKS



She disclosed that the first 90 seconds of an interview are of at most importance. She also suggested the students to research about the company on their LinkedIn profile as well as social media accounts before the interview, so that they get a gist about them, increasing their chances of winning the interview.

The dress code should be according to the culture of the company and if the student is

unsure, then formals would be the ideal choice. She added that mentioning one's strengths and skills could give an extra point. She gave a quick demo wherein she had some questions as examples which helped them get a better idea about it.

Yogja Singh concluded the session by conveying that one should look professional and should always carry a smile. In the end, she held an interactive session where the students had put forth their queries and she willingly answered them.

BMS student from St Xavier's College, Mumbai bags ₹30L annual package

City colleges affiliated with the University of Mumbai (MU) have attracted a mix bag of jobs in the on-going placement season. While in some colleges the annual packages have not matched last year's numbers, several colleges did much better than the previous year. By Shreya Bhandary, Mumbai

In a first-of-its-kind placement season, which was conducted online across city colleges, a final-year Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS) student from St Xavier's College has bagged a job offering a remuneration of ₹30 lakh per annum.

City colleges affiliated with the University of Mumbai (MU) have attracted a mix bag of jobs in the on-going placement season. While in some colleges the annual packages have not matched last year's numbers, several colleges did much better than the previous year.

"Several big companies have not changed their recruitment programme, though smaller companies were affected by the lockdown and the strain of the economic slowdown. However, companies from sectors such as the fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG) and consultancy have managed to offer maximum number of jobs this year," said Soni George, head of the management studies department and placement convener of St Xavier's Autonomous College.

At RA Podar College in Matunga, a final-year undergraduate student was offered an annual package of ₹11 lakh in the first phase of placements. Officials from the placement team told

HT that while students were content with the salary package offered this year, most were expecting a better variety of job profiles. Some regular recruiters also were a no-show this year.

"There has been an increase in the number of finance profiles and a dip in the marketing profiles offered, unlike previous years, for no specific reason. Many of our regular companies either denied hiring for the entire year or displayed uncertainty and delay when it came to recruitment plans," said a spokesperson for the institute. Last year, the highest package received by a student of the institute stood at ₹13 lakh per annum.

At Jai Hind College in Churchgate where the placement process is still underway, the highest salary package received is similar to last year and the institute witnessed a growing trend of more Edu-Tech and Fin-Tech companies offering jobs to their students. Like every year, students have also opted for jobs which not only offer a good profile and package but also allow them the flexibility of applying for further studies along with their job.

"More than one hundred registered final-year students of our institute have already been

placed in the first phase of placements this year. Along with the regular finance, marketing and HR companies offering jobs, there has been a rising trend of job offers coming from education as well as social sciences sectors," said Nainesh Koli, placements coordinator for NM College and Mithibai College. He added that the highest salary offered to a student of the institute stands at ₹11 lakh this year. Last year also this figure stood at ₹11 lakh.

While many companies are still waiting for the lockdown to end before bringing new employees on-board, in some cases, the companies have already welcomed students with a virtual orientation programme.

"Good job profile and remuneration package have been acceptable and as per the students' demands this year, but the best part has been the decision of some companies to on-board students virtually and letting them absorb the experience while they still can," said Navin Punjabi, vice-principal of HR College, Churchgate. He added that the highest package received by a student from the college stands at ₹11 lakh this year, similar to last year.

How Tech is Transforming Financial Regulations

A session to help students develop an understanding of the role of Technology in Finance Regulation was conducted by Mr. Rajnish Magan, CFO at Beumer India Pvt. Ltd and in association with CIMA.

The program commenced with Mr. Rajnish Magan, CFO

at Beumer India Pvt. Ltd. mentioning about the Mega Trends that drive an economy forward. The points discussed included Pandemic & Health crisis, Cyber Threats and Over Regulation which were identified as potential threats to a company's growth prospects. 

In this webinar on the stock market and its role in capital markets, the speaker with her expertise, did justice to the topic and explained how a stock exchange standardizes investments, allowing people to buy or sell discrete and equal shares of ownership in various companies. It facilitates the transfer of funds between investors and businesses, regulating as necessary to provide maximum safety for everyone's investments. The capital market is where companies go to raise financial capital (money) in general. The stock market is exclusively where investors trade stocks (shares of ownership in publicly traded corporations). Companies can raise money on the capital market by selling shares of stock in the company or by issuing bonds.

Rehana announced the results of the competitions FinQuest and Briefin conducted during the week. The money week was one of the many successful initiatives by the BFM Committee that helped seed the knowledge of the financial markets.


WORKSHOPS

WORLD WATER CONSERVATION DAY QUIZ


March 22, 2021




CELEBRATING THE BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF LOKMANYA TILAK AND ANNABHAU SATHE

August 9, 2020



INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DAY


August 13 2020

WEBINAR ON BLOOD DONATION


August 30, 2020

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
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GANDHI JAYANTI & LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI JAYANTI CELEBRATIONS




NATIONAL VOLUNTARY BLOOD DONATION DAY


Community Model

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

24th May– 28th May, 2020

✓ Despite the prevailing extraordinary circumstances due to COVID-19, our commitment to empower people is one we shall live up to.

Starting from 24th MAY we conducted an InstagramLive series with 5 new topics and 5 different speakers for 5 days continuously with experts from the concerned fields under menstruation to spread knowledge of topics of critical importance.

UNICEF CHALLENGE

28th May, 2020

On the occasion of World Menstruation Day, we took up the RED DOT CHALLENGE started by UNICEF. A video where more than 150 people from all around the world took up the challenge and pledged to end the stigma surrounding menstruation was created, where we all the various clubs within the college and Enactus community worldwide came together to make this challenge a huge hit.



PERIOD PARTY

June 28 – July 31, 2020

Conducting various webinars regarding period problems with founders of several organizations working in the field of sustainable menstruation, young authors encouraging youth to destigmatize period myths with ease and international menstrual coaches empowering women to embrace their cycles and learn the best possible ways to live them.

An Oscar winning film based on menstruation- “Period. End of sentence” was streamed on Google meet to explain menstruation in India under 40 mins.

PERIODICALS

Periodicals, an IGTV series curated to educate people regarding Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) and Periods in general. Using interesting facts and real world statistics as our tools, we would be explaining about periods and all the major issues under MHM through this series. An initiative towards breaking the Period Stigma.



#TacklingTheTaboo CAMPAIGN

In the #TacklingTheTaboo we gave the youth a chance to take a pledge to normalise menstruation and bust all the taboos around this natural process and to bring out change in menstrual stigma by asking our participants to make a short video clip of themselves stating how, as an individual, they'll take initiative and pledge to eradicate any existing menstrual stigma/taboo.

DONATIONS & DISTRIBUTION DRIVES

Project Inaayat was initiated with a hope that every woman has the privilege of menstruating under hygienic conditions. Taking a step towards this aim, on 4th October 2020 our team planned and executed a distribution drive of sanitary pads in a small village called Gaimukh Village. This village, although just a few miles across the city of



Thane, is home to various traditional tribal communities who have very little access to any kind of menstrual hygiene products. Aided by the generous donations by

our sponsors: Rotaract Ghatkopar, Sophia Desouza and various leo and lions clubs, a total of 300 kits were successfully funded for this distribution. We are extremely thankful to them for collaboratively recognising the need for making sustainable menstrual products accessible to these tribal women.

The entire distribution process was handled efficiently and smoothly by the volunteers by our collaborative partners: Aarna foundation who were critical in making this distribution drive a success.

The month of November brings in a festive mood and In an attempt to lighten up lives for diwali this year, our team planned another distribution drive of inaat kits on 6th November. Covid has ushered in challenging times for orphans and we recognised two orphanages in Mumbai : Bal bhavan and Amcha ghar who were in need for menstrual products. A total of 80 kits were distributed between these two Orphanages for young girls aged 13- 18 years. To usher in the new year on a bright note, In January with the generous donation by our technical partners DFG, our team donated 100 sanitary kits to rescue foundation. Rescue foundation is an organisation that helps abandoned sex workers and helps them rehabilitate into safer spaces.

Project Aajeevika

Aajeevika, in Hindi, refers to 'livelihood' and implementing on the same



We started this project to provide employment to the rural women of Maharashtra, thus increasing their family incomes and henceforth, enhancing their standard of living.

Canvas tote bags and Transparent masks were one of the first items to be manufactured under Project Aajeevika. We have executed this concept via two fold application of social entrepreneurship. We make these tote bags out of canvas clothes which makes it environment friendly and reusable. Its biodegradable and is very handy. These bags are stitched by the rural women of Maharashtra who have been trained by us. In this way, we provide employment and skills and promote woman empowerment. We provide customizing services too. These tote bags are lashed by trendy and quirky designs. We promote the use of cloth bags and condemn plastic use of any kind. Join us and change not only the perspective of environment friendly concepts but also women empowerment.

While the masks, which has become the "new normal", helped people with speech and hearing disabilities, who lip-read and use sign language, to communicate better with each other and the outside world on a daily basis. Sign language is not simply handed gestures but a combination of hand movements, facial expressions and body language. Hence, communicating without risking life posed to be a serious issue for them that called for an immediate action. To tackle the same, we came up with our own range of cloth masks, with a transparent plastic panel near the mouth area that makes the expressions of the person visible and readable. This helps the Deaf and Mute community to communicate better.



ZERO WASTE MODEL

Zero Waste is a set of principles focused on waste prevention that encourages the redesign of resource life cycles so that all products are reused. There is a growing global population that is faced with limited resources from the environment. To relieve the pressures placed on the finite resources available it has become more important to prevent waste.

The business model of our Project Aajeevika is focused on Zero Waste principles and hence the products produced are crafted wholly from fabric cut offs, which strongly supports sustainability by protecting the environment, reducing costs and producing additional jobs in the management and handling of wastes back into the industrial cycle.

Our Zero Waste designs strive for reduced materials use, use of recycled materials, use of more benign materials, longer product lives, reparability and ease of disassembly at end of life.



An ideation contest for students of HR College where if they were given a chance which innovative product /venture would they like to start or manufacture to achieve at least one SDG.





Rotaract is a worldwide organisation of young men and women aged 15 to 30 based in over 170 countries. The Rotaract Club of H.R. College is the youth wing of the Rotary Club of Bombay. The Rotaract Club of H.R. College is an integral part of the R.I. District 3141, which comprises of over 70 clubs all over Mumbai and has a total membership of over 4000. The Rotaract Club of H.R. College has been the No. 1 Club all over Mumbai City for 14 consecutive years and aims to continue with the tradition.

The Rotaract Club of H. R. College was chartered on 30th June, 1986. The year 2019-20 is the 34th year for the club with a total membership of over 250 students. It is the oldest club in the college with a total of 360 projects per year consisting of cultural projects, community-based projects among others.

Some of the major projects are:

Aashayein - Adopt A Village: aims at the holistic development of rural villages of Maharashtra. It includes providing water, water conservation facility, education, entrepreneurship, human development, light etc. Various PR and fund-raising activities have been undertaken for the same.

BOOND (water) involves providing safe and clean drinking water by means of building tube and surface wells.

Giving is the new cool for Mumbai's Rotaractors

When the taskforce of the Rotaract Club of HR College, RID 3141, wrapped their young minds over a set of grim statistics which pointed out that 16.3 crore people in India lack access to safe drinking water, 28.7 crore people lack basic education and 20 crore people have no access to reliable power, they decided to do something about it.

“Everyone wants to see change, but no one wants to be the change. So we said let prepare ourselves to be that change,” says Jinay Parikh, director of the club's taskforce. Hence was born Aashayein-Adopt A Village, a community initiative with the objective to do holistic development of rural villages in Maharashtra. Their most powerful mantra was collaboration.

Carried out in five villages in Ahmednagar district, the Rotaractors focused on water and sanitation, electricity and education. In collaboration with the Watershed Organisation Trust, the Project Boon was started, “under which we have built 14 wells, four check dams and a number of hand pumps,” says Purvi Todi, co-director of the taskforce team.

Next, partnering with the Liter of Light, an organisation that has put together an open source design for a low-cost tube light that refracts solar light to provide daytime interior lighting, “we have installed more than 150 solar powered lights, including community street lights, study lamps and house lights, in these villages,” says Parikh.

For the education and entrepreneurship component of their social outreach initiative, the Rotaractors started Gazab Maharashtra, to educate youth about the importance of entrepreneurship and business studies. “Till date we have funded 60 entrepreneurs with seed capital to set up self-owned and sustainable businesses,” he says.

In addition, 30 re-usable sanitary kits, which can be used up to 4–5 years, were distributed in these villages, and four community toilets were also built. “We have also conducted workshops with the villagers to teach them the importance of sanitation and hygiene,” Purvi adds.

Parikh says the Rotaractors realised that due to drought conditions in these villages, “there was no work in farms and the farmers couldn't get enough produce for sustenance. We are grateful to RAC HR College, who came to our rescue and built check dams, tanks and wells in these villages.”

SANITATION - Teaching village women the basics of menstrual hygiene

GAZAAB MAHARASHTRA (education) involves going to the village for a one-week duration and teaching the villagers economics, commerce and entrepreneurial studies followed by a business pitch on ideas and funding is provided to the best ideas.

LITER OF LIGHT (light) involves installing street and home lights in the areas of the village devoid of light.

SANITATION is to educate village women about basic menstrual hygiene and distribution of sanitary napkins, re-usable for a span of 3 years.

Lunchbox is a Community Service initiative where food is provided to the poor. The members of the club come together with various food items in different areas of the city. They then pack lunch boxes and distribute it to the poor in the surrounding areas.

The Lunchbox - Covid Relief Edition is an initiative in collaboration with Srimad Ramchandra Love and Care NGO with an aim to provide food and water to the migrant workers and the people in need. In the course of only two days, members donated 2000+ theplas and 300+ biscuit packets along with more than 1000 bottles of water from the NGO's end.



Members of the club have fed a million people by distributing packs of nutritious food at railway stations and in slum areas under LUNCHBOX.

Vogue, a legacy of 23 years, is an interschool personality contest and talent hunt that involves most of the prestigious schools of Mumbai. It is divided into a total of 3 phases and 2 categories. The 2 categories for the same are personality and talent. For Phase 1, there are children from the grade of 7-10 that are hand-picked by our members. Through this project, we aim to develop the personality of these children over a span of 8 days, that is, phase 2. With various activities and workshops, they are able to get a peak of the outside world. After spending time with children of different schools, they are trained for the final day where they battle it out against each other to win various titles. Thus, this project cultivates them into a confident person with a strong personality. The 23rd Vogue happened at Sophia Bhabha Auditorium on February 4, 2020.

Action Replay is another professional development project, in its 11th year on September 21, 2019. It is

Mumbai's biggest open sports and entertainment fest. This project has two aspects to it: quiz and entertainment. For the quiz, there are two categories, the school category and the general category. Members of the best quiz clubs from all over Mumbai participate in the same with a competitive spirit. On the other hand, the entertainment sector includes box cricket, football, Fifa and various other games wherein the members and the participants compete.

Udaan is a Community Service initiative taken by the Rotaract Club of H.R. College. Through this project basic personal hygiene and sanitation is taught to the under privileged. Members distribute kits including basic hygiene necessities. They provide sanitary napkins to the girls at a low cost. Employment opportunities are also provided to the ladies of the slums. This year Udaan took place at Cuffe Parade and Colaba Slums.

Fifa Streets is a project which provides an equitable platform for the boys of the slums in the field of sports. It is a football tournament that gives them a chance to showcase their talent to the entire world.

The Unheard Voice is an ongoing project that inspires and motivates people through the platform of social media. It is a 3-week long project. Different and diverse people are interviewed and their stories are posted on Instagram that makes their voice heard to hundreds of people.

Tak Dhinak Dhin is an intra-institute dance competition wherein members go to 10 different municipal schools in the city. The kids have fun dance sessions. After around one week of fun dance practice with the kids, they compete against each other on the final day.

Quicksilver is also one such project where in the members go to various institutes in Mumbai. Over a span of 5 days, they train the kids in the educational as well as extra- curricular sector. All of them then battle it out on the final day through quiz, fashion show and various other activities. The finale was held on September 7, 2019 at the K.C. Auditorium.

We are the World, a 19 year old legacy, is a two-day annual Interschool internationally themed cultural extravaganza where the top 30 schools of Mumbai come together and battle it out amongst various events to win the title. There is a total of 25 events consisting of Fine Arts, Literary Arts, Performing Arts and Informals. A crowd total of 5000 people every year witness this extravaganza. This being the 19th year the event was

taken a notch higher with an outdoor venue and ongoing activities like never before. The 19th We Are The World took place at H.R. College and Karnataka Sports Ground on November 30 and December 1, 2019.

This is one project where RCHRites go down to a building site and build houses for the homeless. It's has been going on since the past 7 years and till today members have helped successfully construct 10 houses for the underprivileged. This year House of Dreams took place at Gawandiwadj, Karjat on February 19, 2020.

Evolution-Revolution, a mission to evolve a life and revolutionise the society, is a 6 weeks long project where to focus on the kids of the Bhavishyaan community and aim to teach them everything but academics. Each session focuses on particular life skills such as health and hygiene, communication and presentation, marketing, values, and many more, and these life skills are taught to the kids through various fun activities and modern technology. This year it took place at GK Marg Municipal School, Lower Parel from January 31 to February 14, 2020.

Back to School Drive & Paathshala are two such projects that focus on the academic development of the kids of Bhavishyaan community of municipal schools. These projects revolve around the overall development of the kids and help mould them into confident and independent individuals in future.

COVID-19 Warriors


August 8, 2020




CHASING REAL

September 18-24, 2020

The main aim of the event was to normalize all the imperfections imposed by the society, begin a filter free era, accept ourselves just the way we are and chase the real us. Student United Way started promoting the event via Instagram and WhatsApp with the help of messages and posters. We asked people to send in their no-filter pictures via google form so as to show society how beautiful we are even without filters or makeup and requested them to post their no-filter pictures on Instagram and WhatsApp by using #chasingreal. 188 people accepted this challenge and posted their pictures without filters by using the hashtag, showing society how they have let their insecurities go.

We asked people to send in their self-acceptance stories, i.e., stories where they questioned themselves for the way they are, whether they were treated differently by society and how they overcame their insecurities. All these pictures were put on our Instagram story as well. 12 people shared their self-acceptance stories while few preferred to stay anonymous. On September 24, 2020, the self-love pictures and stories were posted on our Instagram page. Many found this event powerful as it had a



positive impact on people. Chasing Real helped many to gather the courage to post their pictures in their own skin without fear, insecurity or shame.

THE TREE PLANTATION CAMPAIGN

September 29 - October 5, 2020

The members of Student United Way commenced The Tree Plantation Campaign to make this world a better place by focusing on the importance of plants in our lives. The event was promoted on Instagram and WhatsApp by means of posters and messages. We requested people to send in their pictures and videos of planting, maintaining hygiene and social distancing, considering the pandemic. - **Road Safety Quiz - January 24, 2021**
A quiz prepared by United Way, Mumbai was distributed among people, through the volunteers, to gauge the knowledge of road safety in the minds of public.
- **Road Safety Poster Making Programme - February 3-5, 2021**
Ask people to make at least one handmade poster on the topic of road safety. With this activity, road safety is etched in their memory and this helps people to be alert.
- **Road Safety Social Media Engagement Programme - February 24-25, 2021**
Promote six digital posters of road safety prepared by United Way, Mumbai; on the social media handles, so that maximum people can reflect over road safety and the important role it plays in our lives.

On April 9, 2020 pictures were posted on the Instagram page to show how SUW had taken a step towards change.



The third panelist for this event was Ms. Divyangana Trivedi, an author, law student and founder of the Will and Way organization.

The discussion commenced with Ms. Shraddha Agarwal who talked about the misogynistic representation of women in media, the influence of Bollywood on rape culture and the normalization of toxic masculinity in society. She highlighted how caste and gender hierarchy play a role in doubly oppressing women. R Balaji shared their personal experience of being sexually assaulted as a child and as a male victim of rape. They talked about how they dealt with homophobia and why negative gender

One of the key points she made was that rape is gender neutral and hence laws regarding rape need to be gender neutral too. 
November 19, 2020


The Students' Council initiated H.R. VOICE to make the students' voices be heard.





Though online, The Sports Council along with The Students' Council successfully executed the responsibility of carrying





September 18, 2020




The Cascade Club of H.R. College celebrated one of the most exciting events of junior college - phase 1 of its flagship event CELESTE virtually on zoom.



CREOLE IDENTITIES AND RACIAL AMERICA: NATIVE AMERICAN HISTORY AND SLAVERY

Race and race-relations have always been at the centre of my interest in the study of United States. With “Black Lives Matter” movement intensifying the fight against racial discrimination and police violence, particularly after George Floyd's tragic death on 25th May 2020, I wanted to go back to a book I had read in 2010. I am very interested in unpacking the category of race as a social and political construct and how the history of capitalism, colonialism and eugenics have had a huge role to play in what we understand of the term 'race' today.

So recently I have begun re-reading Christina Snyder's fabulous work *Slavery in the Indian Country: The Changing Face of Captivity in Early America*. This is a book that traces the history of slavery, captivity and bondage through the pre-Columbian times to 1840's set particularly in the American South. The book is a fascinating account of how Native Americans took prisoners of war; killed, adopted or enslaved them and how the captives included a wide range of enemies: Europeans, Africans and other Indians. Until the late eighteenth century, age and gender played the most important factors in deciding fate of the captives. Race was not so much an issue. However, as the political and economic fabric of America started changing, Native Americans began to racialize slavery. The target became more specific: Africans/African-Americans, who were already being brought in by the settler colonial groups as chattel.

The Second Seminole war between the United States and the Seminoles came to an end abruptly and apparently by 1838. This war is particularly significant for two reasons:

first, it symbolized the formal closure of the U.S. borders to the south of Florida and the near total removal of Native Americans (henceforth I shall use the term Indians as they were known during the colonial conquest) from their homeland of thousands of years. Secondly, it established U.S. autonomy secured along hierarchical racial lines. The categories of race became frozen, fixed and impossibly exclusive.

It is interesting to note that till the early 18th century, colonial America, particularly the Indian nations, did not practice discrimination purely on the basis of race. Captives and slaves (White, Black and Indians) were prized on the basis of sex and age. Historical research affirms that captivity and slavery were flexible institutions which allowed for varying degrees of severity and violence, chances of recovery and retrieval, and access to social uplift or freedom through adoption or marriage. Slavery was also not trans-generational. Children born of slave parent/s, were adopted by the community and awarded kinship ties. This kind of incorporation of outsiders led to the construction of a creolized, multi-ethnic, diversified population that challenged the racial fixities that emerged in the late 18th century America.

By the time Andrew Jackson declared the Second Seminole war a success, United States of America had become a chattel nation, building its fortunes singularly on the backs of Blacks. Closing off the blood tributaries that ran through the length and breadth of the country, – co-mingling and con-joining – the United States chose to deny the fluidity and hybridity that characterised Americanness. Instead, the increasingly hardening racial

lines among the frontier people, changed the colour and composition of the country forever.

Here I want to connect Stuart Hall's essay "New Ethnicities" which talks about deconstructing the racial construct of 'Black' as a social category and not as something conceived in some natural, originary moment of creation; to these historical moments when race became mythologized, unified and immutable, through scientific rationalism, social sanction and legal intervention. Slavery in the New World came to rest in phenotype and began to get exclusively constructed around the progenesis theory which relegated Blacks at the bottom of the racial ladder. As slavery became fixated around race, the institution centralized around the notion of racial destiny (Whites to rule, Indians to disappear and Blacks to serve) and inscribed itself on the body of the Black person. 'Black' as a racial category began to stand in for 'slavery'.

The constructedness of 'Black' was so severe that it solidified in all colonial nations from the South America to the Caribbean, from United States to Great Britain, and Africa. The 'Black slave' trope carried across the Atlantic consistently narrowing in its signification to stand for – captive, commodity, chattel, emasculated, mute and invisible. It is this narrowing of signification, this unifying framework of racial identity based on the hegemonic politics of the privileged that Hall takes up cudgels against. In his essay, he speaks up politically to dismantle this historically constructed category of 'blackness' and

exposes how "blacks were positioned as the unspoken and invisible 'other' of predominantly white aesthetic and cultural discourses." (Hall, 441) It is my intention to go back to a particular history of the construction of blackness as a racial category and show how the term was strategically carved out of a creole nation's desire to maintain absolute categories of identities based on the privileges and penalties of inclusion and exclusion within the boundaries of race.

It is this creole history that needs to be put back at the centre of the debate around race and racism. By understanding that race, caste, gender are all social categories invented by humans and used in order to create a hierarchy that benefits only a few; we should be able to question them, dismantle them and destroy them completely. History can aid us in this purpose and we must go back to it for a deeper understanding of who we are and what we want to become.

It also taught some to LIVE their LIVES...


