1st place Lavanya Bhatia from Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies and Mahima Arora from Hansraj College by reviving the company - Orkut.



If a team is unable to answer a question, their KBC Quiz will be terminated. Each contingent was given 3 lifelines ie, Phone a Friend, 50-50, and Expert Advice. Each question has to be answered in 30 seconds.

It was an online Debate Fusion Competition that included a few twists beforehand the participants' performance. A PDF was circulated among the participants before 30 minutes of their performance that included some Bollywood songs' references that could be used by the debaters in their opening speeches to score brownie points i.e. a few additional points. The contingents began by delivering the opening speeches for 2 minutes. They were allowed to raise a cross-question for their opponent. However, no follow-up questions were entertained.
