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U.S. Justice Dept. says it has evidence that a group of people, including a man in a dark suit, were involved in a scheme to defraud investors. The group, known as the 'Lone Star Fund,' was based in Texas and operated from 1998 to 2001. The scheme involved selling shares of the fund to investors, many of whom were elderly and vulnerable. The fund's assets were largely made up of real estate and other illiquid assets, which were sold at a significant discount to investors. The Justice Dept. is seeking to recover the funds for the investors and is currently reviewing the case.
