

# 10 MUST WATCH HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTES IN MAHARASHTRA

**M**umbai 'The City of Dreams' where people from across the whole country come to see their dreams come into fruition. Back in the 1960s, when Mumbai was allegedly referred to as 'Bombay'. A group of few visionaries came to Bombay with their one shared dream, a dream to introduce Bombay to its newest College of Commerce and Economics. It was on the dawn of June 20, 1960, that Bombay saw the historic establishment of its newest College of Commerce and Economics; and its doors wide-open ready to embrace anyone that sought knowledge. The city back then was not so populated; this created a sense of concern in the mind of the Principal at the time, if he would have enough students to fill his classes. Whatever happened next was a dream come true for the founders, History shows that classes filled up soon enough! Located on 123 Dinshaw Wachha Road, at the intersection of the road that faces the University of Mumbai, with its imposing clock tower, the College was founded on the principle of 'Idealism'.

Hassaram Rijhumal (HR) College of Commerce and Economics was initially set-up in Hyderabad Sind in the year 1945, before the partition. The fledgling Institution had to be hastily forsaken in the storm of Partition. However, as the saying goes "Fire is the test of gold, Adversity, of strong men" so was the determination of the foresighted and feisty founding fathers of the College. The trials were tremendous, but so was the tenacity of the many mighty men who were determined to germinate this institutional oak again. Finally, after many hardships and sacrifices of numerous leaders, the Institute was again established in Bombay in 1960.

An interesting yet not coincidental fact worth mentioning is that when the college first started in 1945, Shri H.C. Malkani was appointed as its Principal. Finally, when the College was reborn in Mumbai in 1960, the mantle yet again fell upon the industrious Shri H.C. Malkani, to take on the 'Principal' role in mentoring and remaking the destiny of an institution that was so closely linked to his own! It seemed as if the two, the College and Principal H.C. Malkani, were a match made with a divine exactitude that not even the ruinous partition could rend asunder.

H.R. College was the first college in Maharashtra to be accredited 'A' grade with a score of 87.95% by the NAAC





(National Assessment and Accreditation Council) under the revised scheme for 2002. In 2008, HR College was awarded an 'A' grade by NAAC once again with a CGPA of 3.46. In Jan 2013 the college underwent a third accreditation process with NAAC awarding an 'A' Grade to the College with a CGPA of 3.72 on a 4 point scale, the highest CGPA in India under the revised scheme; and the highest score in Maharashtra.

### **HR College of Commerce & Economics on Industry Collaborations**

The College believes in creating students who are not just employable in India but even across International borders. This is why the college prides itself in building effective relationships with all its stakeholders especially the corporate world. The current leaders of HR College strongly believe that a thrust on internationalization through global immersion has resulted in greater teacher-student mobility and the adoption of global best practices. The institute has a very strong 'International Programs Committee' headed by a faculty and a group of students who continuously work on building international relationships with leading foreign universities in the USA, UK, Europe, Australia,

New Zealand, and many other countries. Throughout the year, the institute invites majorly successful alumni and industry doyens to give their suggestions on the courses and curriculum. Similarly, the College hosts visiting faculty and students from leading universities and encourages college faculty to visit the above-mentioned foreign universities. Leading subject experts, university officials, heads of departments from premier colleges, leading academic peers from India and abroad, are invited for orientations and discussions on the curriculum. Apart from all these industry collaborations, the institute realizes that numerous students choose to pursue higher education flying across the seven oceans. This is why the college has tie-ups with various consulates who help students to understand not just the admission and visa processes but also helps students understand the cultural differences that are present in their envisioned foreign universities.

### **An Institute Leading Towards the Height of Excellence**

HR College believes in regular academia-industry interaction to help students be able to understand the ways in which their knowledge can be applied in the real world.

## Pedagogy – HR's Secret to Success

HR College, along with KC College and Bombay Teachers Training College; due to its consistent benchmark performance in NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) was brought by the Government of Maharashtra and RUSA under the umbrella of HSNC University, Mumbai, the State Cluster University. H.R. College being the lead college of the Cluster University aims at providing quality education focusing on the overall personality development of the students by offering them industry-oriented and society-focused programs.

However, any student can only be as good as the lessons that sink into their subconscious at this shaping stage of their lives. HR College of Commerce and Economics realizes and acknowledges this crucial role that teachers play in any students' life. This is why, the institute organizes Faculty Development Programs periodically, on curriculum design and development to train and orient the staff in current and emerging trends. # E-classes shrunk high scorer pool: Principals

Mumbai: Even as the number of HSC high scorers saw a drop this year, some college heads said that the holding of exams in students' own campuses might have helped push up marks in general.

Maximum cases of malpractice—195 (17 in Mumbai division, comprising Mumbai, Thane, Raigad, Navi Mumbai, Palghar) were reported in this year's HSC exams. Some principals added the board may have gone easy on assessment, taking into consideration the tough times the batch faced during the pandemic.

Shobana Vasudevan, principal of Podar College, said though 468 students scored a distinction in the college, high scorers have marginally dropped in comparison to 2020. In that year, 3,110 candidates in the city secured 90% and above. "We have to consider that these students took a written exam after 2 years. Despite difficulties, they have done well."

Rajendra Shinde, principal of St Xavier's College, said the drop in high scores could be an impact of online learning, followed by hybrid learning. "We do not know what happened behind the camera. It is probably an indication of what many educationists perceive as a negative impact of online learning," said Shinde.

Almost every college saw a reduction in their top scorers.

Shubhamraje College in Thane which gave the state its top scorers in science last year saw a fall in its 90% scorers. "This year, only 15 students scored more than 90% as compared to 23 in 2020. The reason was the online mode of classes," said principal Parmeshwar Gatkal. Similarly, at H R College, 90% scorers dropped to 265. "Our results are comparable to 2019-20 when we had 307 students who scored over 90%," said principal Pooja Ramchandani.


In the state, Mumbai division ranked last among the 9 zones. Divisional board chairperson Nitin Upasni attributed Mumbai's rank to the fact that it has the largest population of examinees—3.2 lakh—apart from strict vigilance.



# Thalassemia, money woes don't stop lad from bagging 82.67%

**Mumbai:** A 17-year-old with thalassemia and hearing impairment who is undergoing treatment for depression after having suffered physical and mental torture at the hands of a close family member, has bagged 82.67% in HSC commerce.



**Amrit Singh Chawla**, a student of H R College, is being

raised by his single father who lost his job during the pandemic.

This had a bearing on the family's finances and the teenager's blood transfusions halted. Sanjay Chawla, his father, said Amrit's health has deteriorated since.

Amrit had stopped studying after his mother left home a few years ago. He got back to it after his mentor, Narendra Bambwani, a former HR College faculty, convinced him to return to education. Amrit had joined HR College through the minority quota.

"The toughest part this year was my deteriorating health. There were days when I had an exam and I had spent the entire previous day waiting for a doctor in a public hospital," Amrit said. There were also days when Amrit's hemoglobin level fell so low that his father had to carry him.

The family is deep in debt. Amrit, his father and younger brother sleep on the floor in their Mira Road residence.

"He is our all. Both of us, my brother and I, suffer from rare blood diseases," added Amrit. His younger brother is sickle cell positive at zero hour and has cancer of the lymph nodes.

Their father who is looking for a job said he would like to ensure blood transfusion for Amrit once he finds work.



January 17-27, 2022



The workshop had an international presence, as there was one participant from Afghanistan.

#### Objectives of the Workshop were:

- To understand the key concepts in research methodology.
- To examine the concept of appropriate research design.
- To enable the participants to identify the research gaps for literature review.
- To enhance the thesis writing skills.
- To know how to write citations.

Academic writing is a challenging task for research scholars. There is a need to identify the rationale for research, logical arrangement of the ideas and planning the structure of thesis. Research work needs innovation. Data mining and artificial intelligence are now key concepts that challenge the frontiers of research study. Substantial knowledge of statistics and Excel are primary requirements in the area of social sciences research. The challenges to effective writing call for clarity, precision and thoroughness. Research scholars need good understanding of ethics and its importance in research.

At the end of the coursework, participants gained a good amount of knowledge from eminent speakers in the areas of proposal writing and report writing. The knowledge disseminated by resource persons over the ten days during their sessions will undoubtedly go a long way in helping the research work of participants.



### • CRYPTOCURRENCY 101

September 24, 2021

Department of Economics of KC College under its Speaker Series, and the Department of Business Economics of HR College, organised a talk in collaboration with Meghnad Desai Academy of Economics.

Mr. Prashanth Irudayaraj delivered an online lecture on the topic 'Cryptocurrency 101' to around 70 students. He spoke about the origin of Cryptocurrency, its functioning, and the opportunities of Crypto. The students had questions regarding crypto and its future in the Indian economy. The students found the talk very informative.

#### Key Highlights were as follows:

1. The blockchain ledger is a computer program. It functions as a behind-the-scenes backbone where all [financial] transactions are securely recorded without any intermediaries in a ledger that every participant can see, but no one can change unless by an authorized transaction recorded on this blockchain.
2. The name cryptocurrency is a combination of cryptography and currency. With cryptography, we use advanced math to secure our funds, making sure that nobody else can spend them.
3. It's permission less as no one can stop using cryptocurrency. Centralized payment services, on the other hand, can freeze accounts or prevent transactions from being made.
4. A cheap and fast payment method as a transaction to someone on the other side of the world, money can be with them within seconds – at a fraction of the cost of an international wire transfer.
5. It's speculation since there's no intrinsic correct value for it. Bitcoin is worth what people decide it's worth each day.
6. Bitcoin is the biggest coin by market cap, having first launched just over 10 years ago.
7. Today's major crypto coin players are Bitcoin (BTC), Ethereum (ETH), Cardano, and Ripple.

The session ended with Q&A and all queries were addressed effectively.

## • RUSSIA-UKRAINE CRISIS AND ITS IMPACT ON GLOBAL ECONOMY

March 12, 2022

Students of HR, KC & MDAE attended a session organised in collaboration, by Meghnad Desai Academy of Economics and ORF.

After opening remarks by Mr. Dhaval Desai, Senior Fellow & Vice President, ORF; the speakers were introduced by Dr. Bhagyashri Dabke, Program Coordinator, MDAE.

Both Dr. Sanjay Deshpande, Director of Centre for Central Eurasian Studies, University of Mumbai, and Dr. Nivedita Kapoor, Post-doctoral Fellow, Higher School of Economics, National Research University, Moscow made a run-through of their analysis of the Russia Ukraine Crisis. Several points were raised and discussed well by are speakers.

#### The key highlights of the session are as follows:

1. Ukraine alone makes up almost half of the exports of sunflower oil. If harvesting and processing are hindered in a war-torn Ukraine, or exports are blocked, importers will struggle to replace supplies.
2. Disruptions to food supplies could have "potentially dire consequences" for poor countries.
3. Prices for energy grains and metals soared since the invasion of Ukraine, signaling that inflation rates are poised to accelerate.
4. India could be one of the majorly impacted countries since it imports 80 percent of its crude oil from other countries.
5. India has limited connections relating to the banking & corporate sector with both the countries so the impact shall be negligible in such areas.
6. Russia is also one of the largest wheat producers in the world & accounts for more than 18% of the international exports
7. UPI in financial year 21-22, crossed the \$1 Trillion mark in transactions If UPI can fill such a vacuum it shall be a great leap for India in the finance sector by UPI being the vacuum filler & replacing SWIFT in the Russian market.

## NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICIES IN POST-INDEPENDENCE INDIA

The Research Cell of H.R. College of Commerce & Economics held a public engagement webinar. The objective of the webinar was to permeate the significance of Educational Reforms and the process by explaining what has changed and what should be changed.

Dr. Vibhuti Patel opened the webinar by providing an overview of the National Educational Policy, 1968 continued with the hardship faced in implementing this policy in post-independent India. She explained the various social, economic & political challenges faced by India and the need for education back then. She also put forward some statistical comparisons to show how the literacy rate in India has increased with up to 98% general education enrolment.

Preliminary Focal Area:

1. NEP 1968- A thorough discussion on free and compulsory education, free and thorough education, equalization of educational policy, etc.
2. NEP 1986 revised in 1992- The vision & mission of this reform was discussed thoroughly by mentioning its key areas like Early Childhood Care, plans on setting up Autonomous Colleges, exploitation of rural talent, and materialization of Gandhian ideology as well as focus on various scholarship programs.
3. NEP 2020- This mainly envisions an India-centric education system that contributes directly to transforming our nation sustainably into an equitable and vibrant knowledge society by providing high-quality education to all. It also focused on the new way of learning portals such as E-pathshala on Umang, Swayam.
4. Knowledge-Economy - Dr. Patel discussed how the knowledge economy is a system of consumption and production that is based on intellectual capital. And particularly, it refers to the ability to capitalize on scientific discoveries and basic and applied research. This has come to represent a large component of all economic activity in most developed countries.
5. Contemporary challenges- After a thorough discussion of all the educational reforms and their significance, Dr. Patel also put forward some questions that must be answered before forming a new education policy.

### • ONE-ON-ONE INTERACTIVE SESSION





## PERSONAL FINANCE

He has sound knowledge regarding financial planning and coaching and is a highly skilled in strategic planning and personal finance. He explained how he wants people to come out of the "downloading mode" which would help them see investments with a new perspective. The

Mr. Parihar discussed GST and how it came into force in India and the way it works. He talked about the various types of GST registrations, which includes a taxpayer, tax deductor, tax collector, GST practitioner, non-resident taxable person. The students were then introduced to the types of GST codes i.e., harmonised system of nomenclature/Service accounting Code.

The speaker further explained the seven slabs of GST and enlightened the students with the law of advanced ruling and place of supply. The webinar ended with a Q&A session.

## • BUSINESS VALUATION

The webinar on Business Valuation commenced with the speaker explaining the definition and meaning of valuation. Mrs. Agrawal discussed the various objectives and purpose behind valuing a business, and why it is essential to determine the value of a business accurately. She also explained in detail the three major methods of valuation: the asset method, the income method and the cash flow method. She undermined the factors to be considered while using each method, and the purpose behind using each one of them. Mrs. Agrawal also discussed how business valuation is not just a science but also an art. The webinar ended with a Q&A session.

## • DECODING DERIVATIVES

The BAF Committee organized a webinar with Mr. Vijay Bhambwani, founder and chairperson of Bhambwani Securities Pvt. Ltd. He has also worked as an executive guest columnist at DNA, CNBC- TV18 and as a consultant at IIFL and the author of India's first commodity trading manual.

After a brief introduction about his past experience with writing newspaper columns related to derivatives and other market segments, the students were then introduced to the term derivatives by the speaker and were taught how the cash market determines the cost of derivatives with the help of an incident that happened during his time at CNBC. He quoted derivatives to be "investment of steroids", as the advantage factor is high on both the buying and the selling side. The speaker talked about the future of financial markets and how the entry of fin-tech companies like Robinhood and PayTM will increase the participation in this field.

August 28, 2021






### • THE BUDGET ROUNDTABLE

## FIN-EST Committee





Each session was hosted by an accomplished expert discussing a particular topic related to GST. The topics covered in this course by the respective speakers were:



- Introduction to and working with Power Query.





October 29, 2021

An insightful webinar was held on one of the most in-demand careers of our time, "Strategic Design" with Mr. Pravin Ghodke, an expert in the field and the owner of Keon Design that has successfully collaborated with giants like Johnson and Johnson, Johndeere, and Philips Health Care.

Mr. Ghodke gave a thorough breakdown of different paths under the field of designing. To make the content more relatable, he told a story titled "The Good Kitchen" about a Government facility in Denmark that provided food to senior citizens. He then went on to explain the difference between Graphical Designing and UI/UX Designing and highlighted the latter as a more thriving career in recent times. He then went on to say that communicating the use of the product/service to the masses in the most efficient way is the crux of a designer's job. He then held a Q&A session where based on the audience's demand, he shared many exciting experiences of his career-the life as a designer and the skills a designer should have.

## • INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT

October 30, 2021

A very impactful session on Investment Management was undertaken by Mr. Nikhil Nathani. Besides his achievements in the field of investments, he has managed to acquire a CFA and CAIA Charter as well as being FRM and CIPM certified. He has also represented Delhi in Under-19 Cricket and has worked for Goldman Sachs, State Street, Moody's, and Standard Chartered.

Mr. Nathani enlarged upon Investment Management and its two primary underlying mediums: active and passive management. He spoke at length about the shift in dynamics between the two and what he saw as the way forward for investment management. His next key insight revolved around the need to identify a risk appetite, and the significance of diversifying portfolios. To spell this out for all the novice investors, he also used the Nifty50 index as a control to point out what was the ideal return which one ought to beat if one were to take glaring risks. A handy tip that we also received was that a rule of thumb investment strategy comprises written goals and a 75:25 ratio of dabbling in securities and debts respectively.

The session ended on a poignant note as Mr. Nathani emphasised that despite all the degrees and work experience that one may possess, it is finally the soft skills that are most instrumental in attaining success.

## • STOCK MARKETS

Mr. Jayanth Reddy and Mr. Rohan Doshi who have a demonstrated history of investing and trading in the stock markets were invited to shed light on the topic. Both the speakers shared their vivid experiences in the Trading and Stock Market domain.



October 28, 2021




## • INSTAGRAM LIVE

Although there are various schemes launched for college-going students, not many people know about them and as a result, even the brightest of students are unable to continue their studies. But on the other hand, Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan was a huge success that has contributed tremendously to increasing the literacy rate of our country.




was just 19. His talk, presented in the form of a pre-recorded video, captured his unconventional journey of becoming an 'entrepreneur' at 19. The fourth speaker - Mr. Nimesh Kampani, an alumnus of the Harvard Business School, a C.A by profession has decades of experience in the banking and financial services sector. His speech was about how he puts the use of his passion and how today it's his profession. He shared how he tried his hand at different things, but he never really discovered his true passion - "Ikigai" as he said. Once he did which was mentoring people and startups, he excelled in life. This for him, was "making passion work".

The next speaker for the day, Ms. Depinder Chhibber, an Indian chef who is known for her participation in Masterchef Australia S13, took over the platform via a pre-recorded talk and reminisced about the time she moved to Australia and how her relationship with Indian food brought her peace and comfort. She concluded - Home is food for the Indian Diaspora.

Ms. Shabnam Minwalla the next speaker is a popular writer of children's books in India. She regularly conducts workshops in schools around the country and has been a speaker at numerous literature festivals. She shared her "Lessons from the Rear View Mirror". She talked about Colaba's history filtered through an artist's imagination.

Mr. Jack Randall, best known for hosting his television series, "Out There with Jack Randall" (Nat Geo WILD, Disney+) was the next speaker. In his pre-recorded talk he mentioned how each of us should be local zoologists. He urged the audience to step outside and familiarise themselves with the wild. "Our Animals are homeless" - he stressed. He left the listeners contemplating as he spoke the words "Do we want to be the generation that saves our planet or the one that destroys it?"

The way he narrated his journey from Mumbai at 20ft above sea level to the top of Everest at over 29000ft was simply extraordinary, and the pictures he shared led the audience to imagine and visualize the challenges mountaineers face along with the monumental beauty of nature they witness. He revealed that he still climbed the summit after battling Covid-19.


Having modified the committee to the unfortunately challenging circumstances, the Placement Cell has very articulately provided internship opportunities virtually.

- 3rd place Prem Suthar and Karan Tiwari of H.R. College offered reinventing strategies for - Theranos.





With the theme, **A Literary Paracosm**, a total of 10 events were held at ODC'22, which were as follows:

## 1. Pre-events:

### i. BACK TO VINES

Back to Vines was an event all about reminiscing the vines app and recreating content in its format. The event got a great response with entries from 20 contingents. The judge Mr. Chetan Monga, based on the criteria like comedic timing, creativity, editing, writing, and performance, chose the top entries of the event. The top 6 entries collectively amassed around 24k views.

### ii. SURVIVAL OF THE TWITTIEST

The first round was an elimination round with participants (in a team of two) being given individual google forms per team. There were two interesting and trending topics given in each form. The teams filled their forms with tweets on the topics with their full wit and creativity in the allotted hour. 8 teams qualified for the next round.

For the next round, participants engaged in a debate through tweets. Each group was provided with a topic to debate and was given their stances for the debate. Moreover, each team was assigned a character trait that they had to maintain while tweeting. The participants had to follow the following pattern: Opening tweet, rebuttal 1, rebuttal 2, and closing tweet. The interval between the above was 30 mins each. The judging for both rounds was based on: adherence to the topic, substance, quality of arguments, wit, and creativity.

## 2. Main Events:

### i. EXPEDITION UNKNOWN

For the Elimination Round, participants were asked to mark 20 Paracosm on the map. These Paracosms were provided in the form of clues that were supposed to be decoded. Participants were given 20 minutes to mark the location of the Paracosm on the map. 8 teams qualified from the elimination round. The final round was a Treasure Hunt around the Churchgate area. All the teams were given a clue that led them to a location. At the location, they had to perform a task that was based on public speaking or debating. After completing the task, they would be given another clue, which would lead them to the next location. There were 8 locations, the last two being H.R College.

### ii. SORCERERS OF INTELLECT

Event Heads: Ibrahim Jummal, Nisita Yadav, Vidhi Harpalani; Sub Event Heads: Priyal Jain, Simran Hirani.

There were two elimination rounds held before the final round. The first round was the buzzer round. The contingents answered the questions swiftly. The next round was the KBC round. Each contingent had to answer 10 questions which would have consecutively increasing points.

If a team is unable to answer a question, their KBC Quiz will be terminated. Each contingent was given 3 lifelines ie, Phone a Friend, 50-50, and Expert Advice. Each question has to be answered in 30 seconds.

### iii. THE PLAY OF PERSONA

The participants had to enact a character in the given situation. All the participants enacted their characters skillfully. The characters were paired up and were given the same situation. While one waited outside, the other had to react to the situation as the character provided to them.

#### iv. **CLASH OF WORDS**

Event heads: Dhvaj Solanki and Kiara Xavier; Sub Event heads: Ishika Shah, Steve Pereira and Chhavi Agarwal; Judges for Eliminations: Vinay Pande, Abhishikta Khare; Judges for Finals: Rajesh Sipahimalani, Shilpa Saraf Kamdar.

It was an online Debate Fusion Competition that included a few twists beforehand the participants' performance. A PDF was circulated among the participants before 30 minutes of their performance that included some Bollywood songs' references that could be used by the debaters in their opening speeches to score brownie points i.e. a few additional points. The contingents began by delivering the opening speeches for 2 minutes. They were allowed to raise a cross-question for their opponent. However, no follow-up questions were entertained.

In the Final Round, a period of 35 minutes was allotted to the teams to consolidate their matters. Then, an impromptu task was given to the speakers wherein they chose an emotion out of a box of emotions (laughing, crying, sleepy, and angry) and brought that up in their respective arguments. It was interactive and interesting. It was not just an ordinary debate. However, besides all the fusions, the finalists were left free to openly argue for 4 minutes.

#### v. **PITCH PERFECT**

For the Finale, brands were given to the teams a day before the event and on the day of the event, the teams were given the crisis an hour before the commencement of the event where they also had to prepare a PPT as well as their matter for the pitching.

The event entailed two rounds. The theme for the same was - 'A revolutionary change that you would like to bring about in the society. The first round was an elimination round conducted through Google Forms.

Firstly, participants (in a team of 4-10 members) had to choose a social cause that they wanted to highlight. For the elimination round, they ought to make an introductory gist of their campaign in the form of a video not exceeding 30 seconds.

This video was to be a trailer/ teaser to the video that they would create if they'd qualify for the final round. Results were announced the next day. 6 teams qualified for the next round.

For the next round, participants were supposed to elaborate on the topic chosen by them for the elimination round. They had to prepare a video that would be 2 to 5 minutes long.

The accepted formats were a documentary, a short film, an ad film, a social experiment, etc.- anything that would catch the eye of the audience and help to spread awareness about the concerned issue.






## → INQUEST- NATURAL AND PASSIONAL

## → XXIX International Economics Convention

December 16, 17 & 18, 2021

**The XXIX International Economics Convention was hosted by H.R. College of Commerce and Economics under the aegis of the HSNC Board with the theme "Inflation and Employment - Its Impact on the Economy".**

The **inaugural ceremony** took place on December 16, 2021, with the host team presenting an overview of the theme "Inflation and Employment". Dr. Pooja Ramchandani, Principal of H.R. College for organising the convention and commented on how this year's convention deals with a challenging subject to be debated by the young minds and expected them to come up with solutions to the current problems of inflation and unemployment.

Mr. Anil Harish, past president of the HSNC Board, appreciated the presentation made by H.R. College and mentioned that the Economics Convention was one the oldest International conventions ever run by any educational institution. He encouraged the youth to become more research-oriented.

Dr. Devender Kawday, the Chief Guest, congratulated the students for making the presentation on the theme. Many colleges, he believed, should step forward and urge students to conduct more research. He believed that education plays an important role in solving problems and helping the economy grow.

Vice-Principal Dr. Navin Punjabi, gave a vote of thanks at the end of the inaugural ceremony.

The **second day** December 17, 2021, was marked by the teams presenting the topic for their assigned country and answering questions put forth by their opponents. The topic "Inflation and Employment" concerning the country allotted to the team was dealt with in a specific setting with the help of economic history, correlation charts, statistics, political environments, global trade situations etc. Team India, Brazil, Russia, Germany and France were the countries to take the stage on this day (Each college was addressed by the country allotted to them). Our international college from Bulgaria opened the convention by representing our country, India. They discussed the different factors that influence inflation and unemployment in the United States, as well as the relationship between the two. Team India was closely followed by Team Brazil, which delivered their research report with zeal and precision. Team Russia then discussed issues in the Russian labour market, such as low productivity enterprises, mismatched skillsets, lax enforcement of labour regulations, and poor educational quality, to name a few. They urged the govern-

ment and non-governmental organisations to speed up various start-up training camps and programs. The presentation by Team Germany came to an end at the end of the day. According to their findings, there is no link between unemployment, inflation, and the exchange rate. Philip's curve was used to demonstrate the inverse link between inflation and unemployment.

December 18, 2021, saw the remaining countries i.e. Team Turkey, UK and USA present. Team Turkey examined inflation and employment patterns, discussed theoretical perspectives on the topics, and recommended actions to manage inflation and reduce unemployment. After that, Team UK discussed the considerable shift in the employment rate. To contribute to their study report, they elaborated different modifications made to the Bank of England's policy. They believed that inflation has a significant impact on economic growth, whereas unemployment has a significant impact on the same. The final team to present at the 29<sup>th</sup> Economics Convention was Team USA. Team USA firmly believed that efficient government expenditure might boost aggregate demand in the economy.

Later in the evening, at the valedictory function, Principal Dr. Pooja Ramchandani, congratulated all the teams for the beautiful presentations made by them. Mr. Kishu Mansukhani, President of HSNB Board encouraged students and urged them to come forward and face challenges, bring innovative solutions and thus, help the economy grow.

The Chief Guest of the day, Mr. Aalok Mehta, President, GST Practitioners' Association of Maharashtra and an alumnus of H.R. College of Commerce and Economics, spoke in the brief about the GST and the economic situation. He also spoke about how taxes impact inflation, tax rates and employment concerning our society. The judges were invited to share their thoughts on the research papers and also the presentations made by the teams. All three of them appreciated the efforts put in by all the teams on their research papers and also in the presentations. They congratulated each team and mentioned that every participant is a winner.




## • MASTERCLASS ON THE INDUSTRY LIFE CYCLE AND DISRUPTIVE INNOVATION

## • COLLEGE FAIR 2021- EUROPE EDITION


December 7-10, 2021

### • KING'S COLLEGE, LONDON

December 7, 2021

The webinar in collaboration with King's College, London which gave us an insightful presentation on the study options available there. The event commenced with a brief introduction about King's College by guest speaker Ms Dolan, Head of International Recruitment, King's College, London.

Ms. Dolan started the presentation by giving insights into the history and prestige of the college. Then, she talked about the college's rankings under which she stated that King's College is amongst the top 35 in the world, top 7 in the UK, and top 3 in London. Speaking about a few reasons which could be considered to choose King's, she stated that the students would gain practical knowledge to solve real-world problems and would be able to develop an entrepreneurial mind set. She then spoke about the various courses offered at the college in the fields of management and finance including some additional courses that are taught online only.

Further, she mentioned the entry requirements for postgraduate which included the score requirement of 60 to 65 percentage, depending upon the course taken. Additionally, she mentioned the required score of the English language tests - IELTS, TOEFL, and PTE. She then familiarized the students with the application procedure and the key areas where they examine the applications, which included degree scores, academic references, personal statement (an essay), English language test scores, and work experience.

Ms. Dolan then gave insights about the various career services offered at the college which included career fairs, employer-led workshops, networking with global companies, etc. which helps the student in gaining a broader view of the corporate world. Continuing with the presentation, she introduced 'Unibuddy', an online chat facility available at the official website of the college, where students can chat with current students at the college and get their queries cleared.

The students of HR College are provided with a scholarship of 20-25%. The students were also given insights about the various advantages of living in France - comparatively economical, rental subsidies for students and better visa terms, better ROI.

Mr. Arun spoke of the reasons for considering the UK as a study destination where he stated that the UK universities, which provide scholarship and other financial support, have featured strongly in world rankings, with a great network which helps in availing jobs easily. Further, he gave information about the academic requirements and the documents required for getting into a UK university. Lastly, he talked about the post-study work rights which are accessible in the UK.

Mr. Ashay, the second guest speaker, started with a brief introduction about IELTS and mentioned the reasons for its requirement in the universities abroad. Also, he emphasized the two types of IELTS, i.e., General and Academic, and further mentioned that the one related to studies is the Academic IELTS. Under academic IELTS, he briefly explained the pattern and format of the examination. While winding up the presentation, Mr. Ashay showed us the scoring pattern of the IELTS exam and shared some strategies to achieve a better score.

With such an insightful presentation, Mr. Arun and Mr. Ashay were able to guide the students on IELTS and the reasons that should be considered for having the UK as a study option for further studies. The event concluded with students having a better view of IELTS and UK universities as their future universities.




### • THE CHARITY CARNIVAL





**BODY POSITIVITY**


July 23, 2021






• **MEDITATIVE ART WORKSHOP**






## • HALLOWEEN ICE-BREAKER


## • WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

**• WORLD PHOTOGRAPHY DAY COMPETITION**


August 20, 2021      Participants: 13




### • Innov8-2021

November 8, 2021 Attendance: 45



## Fashioning our Styles: Bodies as Sites of Resistance

The most recent intellectual engagement for me has been re-reading Dick Hebdige's extremely influential book *Subculture: The Meaning of Style*. For a long time, I have been thinking about the way we present our bodies in terms of style and how the body becomes a site of resistance through the way we chose to present it to others. What do we want to say with our bodies? How do we communicate who we are, what we feel, believe, think or do when we style ourselves? Who do we style our bodies for? What does personal style mean and how is it different from group styles? How can style become a complex symbolic form of challenging the norm and the hegemony of the powerful? I guess Hebdige's work on *Subculture* can help us mine through some of the above questions and help us understand how fashion in the subculture can become a point of change and can call attention to the significance of class and power relations that determine existing social order.

Hebdige's *Subculture* seems to be discussing the visible alternative and/or deviant forms of resistance that punctured the music scene of 1970s Britain. Primarily a white working-class movement the subcultural elements appealed predominantly to the young male who seemed to be struggling to cope with the changing demographics of the British society. The book seemed to be starting off as an ethnographic inquiry into how subcultures impact cultural institutions, consolidate or transform ethnic identity, and influence race relations by looking at music and style as a medium of expressing counter-hegemonic tendencies. But somewhere along the way the book became an expose` on style "as a vehicle of collective self-defense" (Delaney, 182) and a strategy to negotiate identity and power relations.

Informed by structuralism and semiotics, Hebdige seems to prefer the visual discourse over the narrative to signify meaning. The book explores major subcultural movements-hipsters, beat, teddy boys, mods, punks, skinheads, dreads, glam, and glitter rockers- to reveal how style could become a symbol of revolt against the everyday social injustices and mark a refusal to conform with the routine. Focusing on 'subculture style' as bricolage and making do with dominant symbols/materials at hand and reducing them to something subversive, Hebdige does connect it also with the idea of graffiti as "your presence on their presence"(Hebdige,3) and examines how style could become an emblem of overwriting oneself in a way that signals the "power to disfigure" (Hebdige,3).

Although the book does contribute to the understanding of how "subcultures are cobble(d) together" (Hebdige 1979) and are in one sense graffiti i.e., they grow out of the parent or

dominant cultures rather than being foreign entities who are inexplicable in their behaviour, customs or manners or are rare implants; the book does seem wanting when it comes to its dealings with race. It overlooks the importance of historical, transatlantic movements that indeed influenced foreign cultures (the Rastafarians and their clarion call 'back to Africa') so in one sense subculture was also making use of materials from a transplanted culture along with the use of materials at hand. In fact, reading the chapter on Rastas did give me a sense that there would be a discussion on the racial dialectic of subculture music but it curiously seems to be absent in the analysis of the music style scene. Hebdige while acknowledging the contributions of Rasta and Reggae, uses race, - "the Negro" - as a springboard to launch the working-class white youth subculture movement without any significant examination of the responses, collaborations, or the intersections that brought black and white musicians of the subculture together (one of which in the late 80's emerged as the "third wave ska" movement). For him, race is not a point of inquiry but a point of departure.

Hebdige's silence over issues of gender and aesthetics in my opinion limits the exercise that he undertakes in the book. The lack of discussion on music is a concern because the styles that he studies are deeply embedded in the aesthetics that inform their music. The whole sexuality issue is also totally overlooked in his examination of these subcultures. Skinheads, Beats, Punks, and Mods perform sexuality. They are either extremely macho or significantly androgynous, engaged in sexually non-normative activities (orgies or groupies or other sexually experimental roles and acts), partially visible in a smoky blur, doing drugs or being in an induced state when performing or not performing, and almost always enveloped with a sense of mystery; inhabiting an underground locale secluded from the world above or outside.

Their agency was definitely related to style, movement, music, relationships, art, and the body; but how far have they been able to effect real change on the ground remains to be seen. I wonder if there is a study which takes that into account. If there is, then that would be a good place to go to.

At the end, it does make me wonder if beats and hippies were counter-cultural in the sense that they touched critical mass and somehow seemed to be linked to the East in terms of their spiritual quest for moksha, liberation from earthly bonds, rejection of individualism and embracing of the community. What then are the architectonics of subcultures? What are the boundaries that mark subcultures? Who belongs and who doesn't? What are the ways in which

subcultures are threatened with cultural appropriation, mainstreaming, and profit-making?

At the end, I think, we style ourselves according to our class positions but many times also in direct defiance to it. The youth subculture today seems to be pretty homogenous, sanitized, and vanilla white. There is a sweeping cultural bulldozing of styles that are imitative in nature. However, we still find pockets of rebellion. Many don't fashion themselves according to the prevalent taste but find their own signature style and present themselves in accordance to their own politics. We can only hope that the radicalism that fashion and styles of subcultures are defined by does not become

## Of Mobile Towers and 5G....



Do we need so many mobile antennae up on our buildings, on the grounds, and in public gardens? Do we need them at all, in the first place? This used to be discussed often through news and articles published in newspapers and magazines, which has now considerably reduced, reasons implied.

People continue to protest in small groups against these, and there's a simple reason: the radiation hazards outweigh the touted benefits. The mobile phone service operating companies offer a handsome amount of money to install these. Building residents, hospitals, commercial houses, educational institutes, marriage halls, and even slums are led to believe that the money defrays their yearly maintenance expenses, but in the long run, actual expenses could be far more: fatal illnesses like cancer, kidney and heart ailments, thyroid, and worrying impacts like memory loss, frustration, violent thoughts and more. So also, the harms of mobile phones and WIFI, in fact, many services that operate using microwave frequency emissions broadcast in public spaces.

The costs of treatment of such ailments are far higher and if one considers the loss of lives, that is simply irreparable, not to speak of the sufferings, the pain, and the trauma. Radiation from MTs also affects wildlife, leading to serious and irreparable ecological and environmental damages like lesser forests, lesser rainfall, lesser water for the humans and the remaining wildlife, storms, droughts, and global warming.

Scientists from around the world researching the impact of radiation from mobile towers have written to WHO [World Health Organisation] regarding it, and other activists have been voicing their concerns. The appeals also ask to stop radiation from extending up into outer space, not just on the Earth.

Obviously, not a simple question to answer. Yet a clue lies in the utility itself: digital communication. Achieving it demands that the best way, the most sustainable way, and the way that benefits the most people not once, but all the time, be found.

**Mr. Vickram Crishna**, in his article, **Communication Power for the People**, takes a long view:

Optic fiber cables are fairly delicate, and need to be safeguarded in tough channels – the signal strength to cable size ratio alters badly when this is factored in. And such channels are ideally placed underground, which means that be it in urban or rural spaces, the amount of dedicated 'real estate' goes up by leaps and bounds – the area surrounding a cable channel cannot be used for most other purposes. Few, if any, other purposes can run alongside, which effectively means the cabling channel blocks off land usage in ways that are rarely (ok, never) discussed. Certainly, the real cost to others arising from such restrictions is not even considered.

In 1995, the Supreme Court informed the government of something it knew all along but pretended was worth ignoring: the airwaves/airspace in India belongs to the people of India, and the state is only the steward. This landmark ruling has been almost continually ignored since then, with, for instance, people's access to ordinary audio (analog) broadcasting not being placed in a legal framework until 2003. This happened after a women's self-help group (with the assistance of some technical inputs) created a radio station for their village, in Andhra Pradesh. After a few months, this was summarily shut down, fearing that they might somehow communicate across our land border to the west (2,000 km away, using their half-km radius broadcast).

However, alongside, digital wireless communication had become ubiquitous – within walled areas. Of course, the

radio signals don't know that and don't care, and that technology continues to grow in capability.

These issues also need to be tackled globally. The Federal Communications Commission ignored thousands of published researched papers and instead invoked unauthorized, outdated industry-tied materials to justify extending current wireless exposure limits. The FCC also misrepresented the position of numerous government agencies, including the Occupational Safety and Health Administration [OSHA] of the US department of labour, the Environment Protection Agency, and the National Cancer Institute.

"During a pandemic, when our children are becoming increasingly dependent on wireless devices, they need to be protected from harm using the latest science. They are, sadly and shockingly, not. Outdated science to maintain insufficient safety standards for this ever-prevalent technology is being used, instead," says Devra Davis, President of Environmental Health Trust.

Devra Davis continues, **"Years from now our grandchildren will ask, Did we do the right thing and act to protect them or did we harm them needlessly, foolishly, and permanently because we were blinded by the addictive delights of our technological age?"**

"The FCC repeatedly ignores repeated calls for more protective regulations from the American Academy of Pediatrics and numerous experts in the field as research shows children are more vulnerable," says Theodora Scarato, Executive Director of Environmental Health Trust. "FCC ignores the ample research that has found numerous harmful biological research—from cancer to brain damage to reproductive damage to oxidative stress. Obstinacy and willful blindness are not reasoned decision-making. Ignoring facts does not change them. Talismanic repetition does not transmute a false assumption into reality. Current regulations are built on an incomplete assessment of the risks posed by RF/EMF [Radio Frequency/Electromagnetic Frequency]. The evidence is compelling."

Despite widespread denial, the evidence that radiofrequency (RF) radiation is harmful to life is already overwhelming. The accumulated clinical evidence of sick and injured human beings, experimental evidence of damage to DNA, cells, and organ systems in a wide variety of plants & animals, & epidemiological evidence that the major diseases of modern civilization - cancer, heart disease, & diabetes - are in large part caused by electromagnetic pollution, form a literature base of well over 10,000 peer-reviewed studies.

- [International Appeal: Stop 5G on Earth and in Space.](#)

If the telecommunications industry's plans for 5G come to fruition, no person, no animal, no bird, no insect and no plant on Earth will be able to avoid exposure, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, to levels of RF radiation that are tens to hundreds

of times greater than what exists today, without any possibility of escape anywhere on the planet. These 5G plans threaten to provoke serious, irreversible effects on humans and permanent damage to all of the Earth's ecosystems.

Immediate measures must be taken to protect humanity and the environment, by ethical imperatives and international agreements.

### **5G will result in a massive increase in inescapable, involuntary exposure to wireless radiation.**

- [Ground-based 5G](#)

To transmit the enormous amounts of data required for the Internet of Things (IoT), 5G technology, when fully deployed, will use millimeter waves, which are poorly transmitted through solid material. This will require every carrier to install base stations **every 100 meters** in every urban area in the world. Unlike previous generations of wireless technology, in which a single antenna broadcasts over a wide area, 5G base stations and 5G devices will have **multiple antennas arranged in "phased arrays"** that work together to emit focused, steerable, laser-like beams that track each other.

Each 5G phone will contain dozens of tiny antennas, all working together to track and aim a narrowly focused beam at the nearest cell tower. The US Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has adopted rules permitting the effective power of those beams to be as much as 20 watts, ten times more powerful than the levels permitted for current phones.

Each 5G base station will contain hundreds or thousands of antennas aiming multiple laser-like beams simultaneously at all cell phones and user devices in its service area. This technology is called "multiple input multiple output" or MIMO. FCC rules permit the effective radiated power of a 5G base station's beams to be as much as 30,000 watts per 100 MHz of spectrum, or equivalently 300,000 watts per GHz of spectrum, tens to hundreds of times more powerful than the levels permitted for current base stations.

- [Space-based 5G](#)

At least five companies are proposing to provide 5G from space from a combined 20,000 satellites in low- and medium-Earth orbit, that will blanket the Earth with powerful, focused, steerable beams. Each satellite will emit millimeter waves with an effective radiated power of up to 5 million watts from thousands of antennas arranged in a phased array. Although the energy reaching the ground from satellites will be less than that from ground-based antennas, it will irradiate areas of the Earth not reached by other transmitters and will be additional to ground-based 5G transmissions from billions of IoT objects. Even more importantly, the satellites will be located in the Earth's magnetosphere, which exerts a significant influence over the electrical properties of the atmosphere. **The alteration of the Earth's electro-**

## **magnetic environment may be an even greater threat to life than the radiation from ground-based antennas.**

- [Harmful effects of radiofrequency radiation are already proven](#)

Even before 5G was proposed, **dozens of petitions and appeals** by international scientists, including the **Freiburger Appeal** signed by over 3,000 physicians, called for a halt to the expansion of wireless technology and a moratorium on new base stations.

In 2015, **215 scientists from 41 countries** communicated their alarm to the United Nations (UN) and World Health Organization (WHO). They stated that "numerous recent scientific publications have shown that EMF [electromagnetic fields] affects living organisms at levels well below most international and national guidelines". More than 10,000 peer-reviewed scientific studies demonstrate harm to human health from RF radiation. Effects include:

- Alteration of heart rhythm
- Altered gene expression
- Altered metabolism

Altered stem cell development

- Cancers
- Cardiovascular disease
- Cognitive impairment
- DNA damage
- Impacts on general well-being
- Increased free radicals
- Learning and memory deficits
- Impaired sperm function and quality
- Miscarriage
- Neurological damage
- Obesity and diabetes
- Oxidative stress

Effects in children include autism, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), and asthma.

Damage goes well beyond the human race, as there is abundant evidence of harm to diverse plants- and wildlife- and laboratory animals, including:

- Ants
- Birds
- Forests
- Frogs
- Fruit flies
- Honey bees
- Insects
- Mammals
- Mice
- Plants
- Rats
- Trees

Negative microbiological effects have also been recorded.

The WHO's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) concluded in 2011 that RF radiation of frequencies 30 kHz - 300 GHz is possibly carcinogenic to humans (Group 2B). However, recent evidence, including the latest studies on cell phone use and brain cancer risks, indicates that RF radiation is proven carcinogenic to humans and should now be classified as a "Group 1 carcinogen", together with tobacco smoke and asbestos.

Most contemporary wireless signals are pulse-modulated. Harm is caused by both the high-frequency carrier wave and the low-frequency pulsations.

- [The deployment of 5G satellites must be prohibited.](#)

The Earth, the ionosphere, and the lower atmosphere form a global electric circuit in which we live. It is well established that biological rhythms - of humans, birds, hamsters, and spiders - are controlled by the Earth's natural electromagnetic environment, and that the well-being of all organisms depends on the stability of this environment, including the electrical properties of the atmosphere. Cherry, in a groundbreaking paper, explained the importance of the Schumann resonances and why ionospheric disturbances can alter blood pressure and melatonin and cause "cancer, reproductive, cardiac and neurological disease, and death".

These elements of our electromagnetic environment have already been altered by radiation from power lines. Power line harmonic radiation reaches the Earth's ionosphere and magnetosphere, where it is amplified by wave-particle interactions. In 1985, Dr. Robert O. Becker warned that power line harmonic radiation had already changed the structure of the magnetosphere and that the continued expansion of this effect "threatens the viability of all life on Earth". The placement of tens of thousands of satellites directly in both the ionosphere and magnetosphere, emitting modulated signals at millions of watts and millions of frequencies, is likely to alter our electromagnetic environment beyond our ability to adapt.

Informal monitoring has already provided evidence indicating serious effects on humans and animals from the approximately 100 satellites that have provided 2G and 3G phone service from low orbit since 1998. Such effects cannot be understood only from consideration of the low levels of radiation on the ground. Knowledge from other relevant scientific disciplines must be taken into account, including the fields of atmospheric physics and acupuncture. Adding 20,000 5G satellites will further pollute the global electric circuit and could alter the Schumann resonances, with which all life on Earth has evolved. The effects will be universal and may be profoundly damaging.

- [5G is qualitatively and quantitatively different from 4G](#)

The idea that we will tolerate tens to hundreds of times more radiation at millimeter wavelengths is based on faulty modeling of the human body as a shell filled with a homogeneous liquid. The assumption that millimeter waves do not penetrate beyond the skin completely ignores nerves, blood vessels, and other electrically conducting structures that can carry radiation-induced currents deep into the body. Another, potentially more serious error is that phased arrays are not ordinary antennas. When an ordinary electromagnetic field enters the body, it causes charges to move and currents to flow. But when extremely short electromagnetic pulses enter the body, something else happens: the moving charges themselves become little antennas that reradiate the electromagnetic field and send it deeper into the body. These reradiated waves are called Brillouin precursors. They become significant when either the power or the phase of the waves changes rapidly enough. 5G will probably satisfy both criteria.

In addition, shallow penetration in itself poses a unique danger to the eyes and to the largest organ of the body, the skin, as well as to very small creatures. Peer-reviewed studies have recently been published, predicting thermal skin burns in humans from 5G radiation and resonant absorption by insects, which absorb up to 100 times as much radiation at millimeter wavelengths as they do at wavelengths presently in use. Since populations of flying insects have declined by 75-80 percent since 1989 even in protected nature areas, 5G radiation could have catastrophic effects on insect populations worldwide. A 1986 study by Om Gandhi warned that millimeter waves are strongly absorbed by the cornea of the eye and that ordinary clothing, being of millimeter-sized thickness, increases the absorption of energy by the skin by a resonance-type effect. Russell (2018) reviews the known effects of millimeter waves on skin, eyes (including cataracts), heart rate, immune system, and DNA.

- [Regulators have deliberately excluded the scientific evidence of harm](#)

Stakeholders thus far in the development of 5G have been industry and governments, while renowned international EMF scientists who have documented biological effects on humans, animals, insects, and plants, and alarming effects on health and the environment in thousands of peer-reviewed studies have been excluded. The reason for the current inadequate safety guidelines is that conflicts of interest of standard-setting bodies "due to their relationships with telecommunications or electric companies undermine the impartiality that should govern the regulation of Public Exposure Standards for non-ionizing radiation". Professor Emeritus Martin L. Pall lays out the conflicts of interest in detail and lists important studies that have been excluded, in his literature review.

- [The thermal hypothesis is obsolete - new safety standards are needed](#)

Current safety guidelines are based on the obsolete hypothesis that heating is the only harmful effect of EMFs. As Markov and Grigoriev have stated, "Today standards do not consider the real pollution of the environment with nonionizing radiation". Hundreds of scientists, including many signatories to this appeal, have proven that many different kinds of acute and chronic illnesses and injuries are caused without heating ("non-thermal effect") by radiation levels far below international guidelines. Biological effects occur even at near-zero power levels. Effects that have been found at 0.02 picowatts (trillionths of a watt) per square centimeter or less include altered genetic structure in *E. coli* and rats, altered EEG in humans, growth stimulation in bean plants, and stimulation of ovulation in chickens.

To protect against non-thermal effects, the duration of exposure must be considered. 5G will expose everyone to many more transmissions simultaneously and continuously, day and night without cessation. New safety standards are needed and should be based on cumulative exposure and not only on power levels but also on frequency, bandwidth, modulation, waveform, pulse width, and other properties that are biologically important. Antennas must be confined to specific, publicly identified locations. To protect humans, antennas must be located far from where people live and work and excluded from the public rights-of-way where people walk. To protect wildlife, they must be excluded from wilderness sanctuaries and strictly minimized in remote areas of the Earth. To protect all life, commercial communications satellites must be limited in number and prohibited in low- and medium-Earth orbits. Phased arrays must be prohibited on Earth and in space.

RF radiation has both immediate and long-term effects. Cancer and heart disease are examples of long-term effects. Alteration of heart rhythm and changes in brain function (EEG) are examples of immediate effects. A syndrome that was called radio wave sickness in the former Soviet Union and is called electromagnetic hypersensitivity (EHS) around the world today can be either acute or chronic. Professor Dr. Karl Hecht has published a detailed history of these syndromes, compiled from a review of more than 1,500 Russian scientific papers and the clinical histories of more than 1,000 of his patients in Germany. Objective findings include sleep disorders, abnormal blood pressure, and heart rate, digestive disorders, hair loss, tinnitus, and skin rash. Subjective symptoms include dizziness, nausea, headache, memory loss, inability to concentrate, fatigue, flu-like symptoms, and cardiac pain.

The EUROPAEM EMF Guideline 2016 states that EHS develops when people are "continuously exposed in their daily life" to increasing levels of EMFs, and that "reduction and prevention of EMF exposure" are necessary to restore these patients to health. EHS should no longer be considered a disease, but an injury by a toxic environment that affects an increasingly large portion of the population, estimated

already at 100 million people worldwide, and that may soon affect everyone if the worldwide rollout of 5G is permitted.

The International Scientific Declaration on EHS and multiple chemical sensitivity (MCS), Brussels, declared in 2015 that "inaction is a cost to society and is not an option anymore... We unanimously acknowledge this serious hazard to public health... [urgently requiring] that major primary prevention measures are adopted and prioritized, to face this worldwide pan-epidemic in perspective" (emphasis added).

In their haste to implement 5G and to encourage the unconstrained use of outer space, the European Union, the United States, and national governments worldwide are taking steps to ensure a "barrier-free" regulatory environment. They are prohibiting local authorities from enforcing environmental laws, and "in the interest of speedy and cost-effective deployment", removing "unnecessary burdens ... such as local planning procedures [and] the variety of specific limits on electromagnetic field (EMF) emissions and of the methods required to aggregate them".

Governments are also enacting laws to make wireless facilities a permitted use in all public rights-of-way. To date, most wireless facilities have been located on private property at some distance from homes and businesses. For them to be spaced less than 100 meters apart as required by 5G, however, they will now be located on the sidewalk directly in front of homes and businesses and close above the heads of pedestrians, including mothers with babies.

Public notice requirements and public hearings are being eliminated. Even if there were a hearing and 100 scientific experts were to testify against 5G, laws have been passed making it illegal for local authorities to consider their testimony. US law, for example, prohibits local governments from regulating wireless technology "based on the environmental effects of radiofrequency radiation", and courts have reversed regulatory decisions about cell tower placement simply because most of the public testimony was about health. Insurers will not provide coverage against EMF risks, and there is zero clarity as to what entity will bear legal responsibility for damage to life, limb, and property arising from exposure to 5G, whether ground- or space-based.

In the absence of an agreed comprehensive legal regime governing activities in outer space, legal liability for those activities is non-existent, despite the prospect of whole continents, the atmosphere, and the oceans being put at risk by them.

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child: States shall "undertake to ensure the child such protection and care as is necessary for his or her well-being" (art. 3), and "ensure ... the survival and development of the child" (art. 6)

and "take appropriate measures to combat disease ... taking into consideration the dangers and risks of environmental pollution" (art. 24(c)).

The Nuremberg Code (1947) applies to all experiments on humans, thus including the deployment of 5G with new, higher RF radiation exposure that has not been pre-market tested for safety. "The voluntary consent of the human subject is essential" (art. 1). Exposure to 5G will be involuntary.

"No experiment should be conducted, where there is an a priori reason to believe that death or disabling injury will occur" (art. 5). The findings of over 10,000 scientific studies and the voices of hundreds of international organizations representing hundreds of thousands of members who have suffered a disabling injury and been displaced from their homes by already-existing wireless telecommunications facilities, are "prior reasons to believe that death or disabling injury will occur".

Today, it is possible to use microwatt telecommunication frequencies freely within a radius of around 100m, and the same low-strength signals can be directed (like a torchlight) over longer distances. The world record is over 200 km (2000x the normal use), and in India, the operating network has been running at a free distance of about 40 km.

**However, one does not need to use microwave frequencies at all. Besides, do we see mobile towers so rampantly installed, or installed atop buildings at all, in other nations? The radiation levels, too, are far higher in our nation than in almost any other.**

**Here comes the substitute for the hazardous, high-frequency radiation-emitting mobile towers atop our buildings and in our vicinity:**

**Lower frequencies, such as the nominal 100 MHz band used for audio FM,** can easily be adapted, at extremely low cost, to carry low bandwidth digital connectivity. Such broadcast centers can provide reasonably reliable connectivity in not just low-income areas, operated by local self-help groups but also in other areas, substituting the hazardous, high-frequency radiation-emitting mobile towers atop our buildings and in our vicinity **because of low-frequency signals propagate better than microwaves.** Each group will set up high-bandwidth wireless 'beams' between each other so that a larger number of people get connected. Such arrangements do not need an external corporate service provider, and the overall setup does not depend upon the centralisation of any kind.

This makes it possible to adopt and also encourages asynchronous communication, a digital version of letter-writing/postage."

Using such methods needs a sea-change in the way that public services are administered in India. We traditionally have used government oversight as a weapon rather than an enabler, and one very obvious result is that immense power

is concentrated in the hands of a very few extremely wealthy individuals. They control a small number of corporations and can use or bypass nominal oversight to create, in effect, monopolies.

So, for instance, the use of FM bands, low-frequency emissions, favours a handful of large corporations, and they in turn work to prevent the operation of such radio frequencies for other purposes. The use of microwave frequencies is allowed at multi-watt outputs in free air, something that only a fraction of countries allow at all, and that (see above) carries a host of warnings based on detailed impact research studies.

Opening up the usage of such frequencies, at microwatt levels, to self-help groups in rural areas, and communities of

people working together in urban areas might present a viable alternative to monopolization by corporations and the handful of incredibly wealthy persons who control them.

India was once a pioneer in telecom switching technology: the world's only modular telecom switch, indigenously developed, still operates after over 30 years in Bengaluru. Adapting such technology to mobile telephony, and placing it in the hands of small local operators, in both urban and rural areas, would present a very viable alternative to present methods that put too much effective power in the hands of a few people, removes both government and civil society oversight, and create employment opportunities on an incredible scale across the country.

## Is Cancel Culture a Form of Activism?

I noticed how everyone has a seemingly infinite audience and when this audience is discontent with what one is saying, they gain more power to make things right, and this power can and will bypass traditional media gatekeepers.
