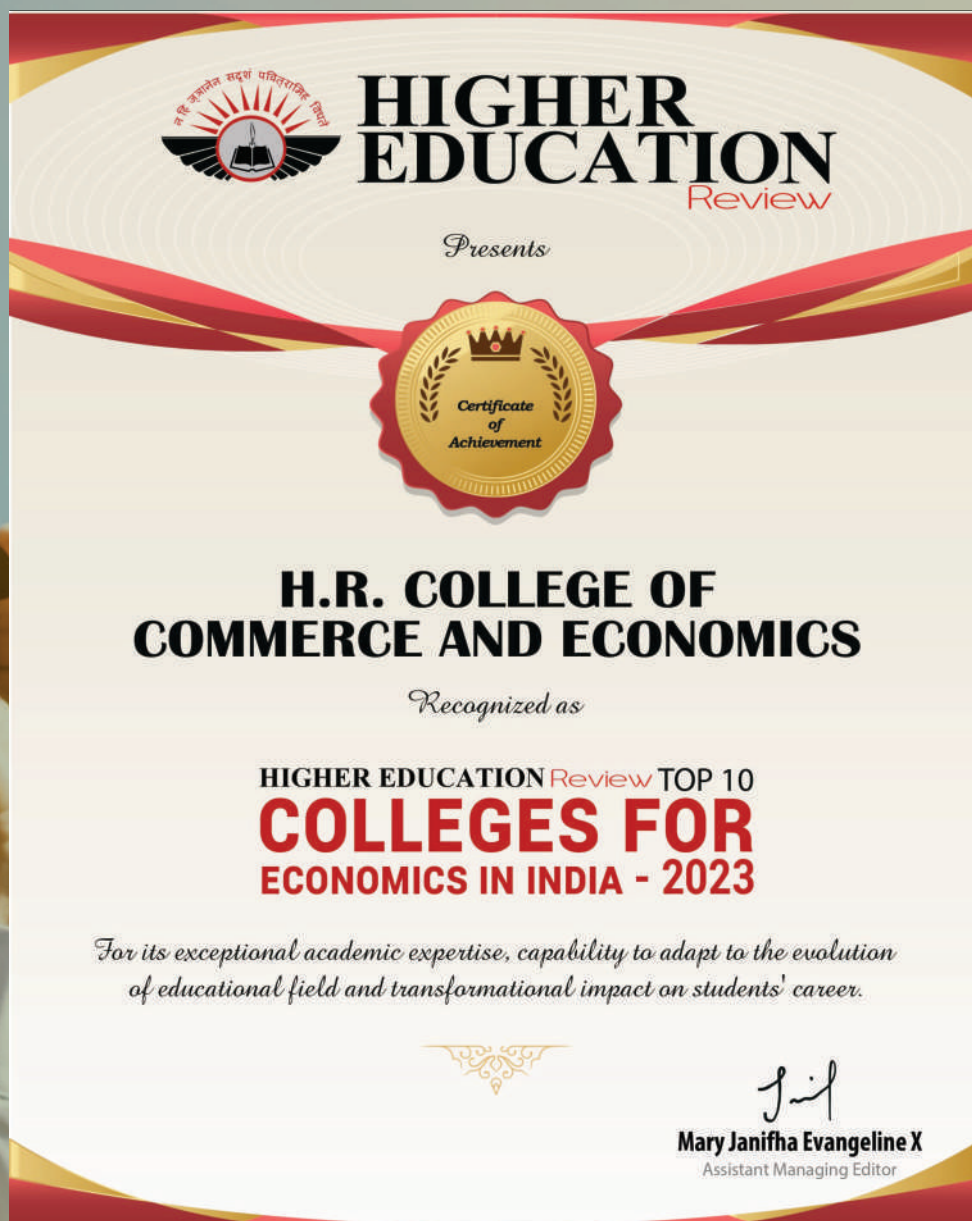

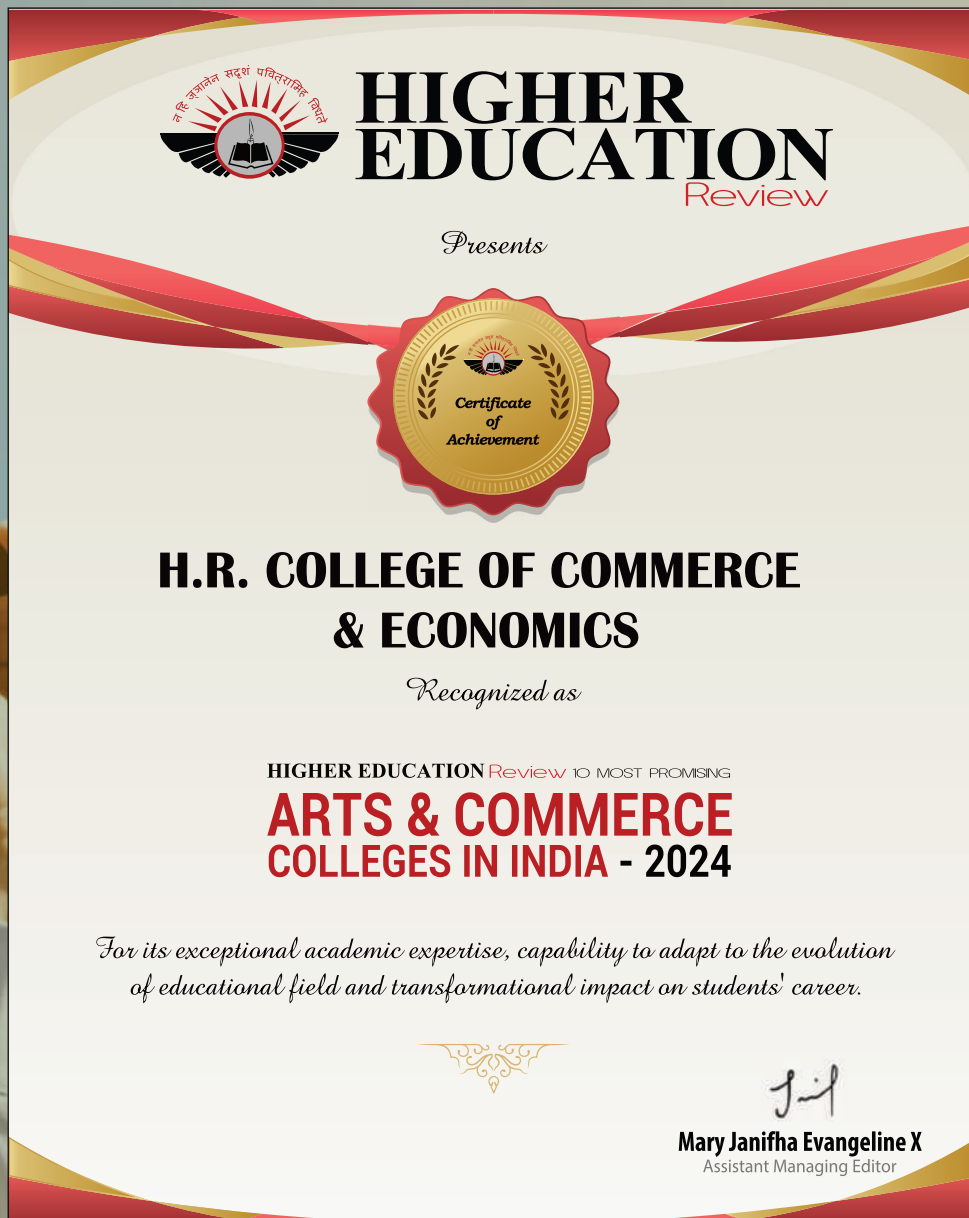

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## HR College rolls out mandatory attendance criteria for students

Students have to fulfil a mandatory minimum attendance criteria from this academic year

The Hassaram Rihumal (HR) College of Commerce and Economics, Mumbai, plans to implement a stricter attendance system from the current academic year. Students will be required to fulfil a minimum of 75% of attendance criteria, a notice of which has also been circulated among students and the staff.

"We observed that students were taking attendance lightly, which had an impact on results," said Pooja Ramchandani, the principal.

"We understand that students take professional courses, and while we are open to it, we believe that some components of academics are important. The value which can only be transmitted to children through classroom attendance and interaction with teachers," Ramchandani added.

While this mandatory attendance criteria is all set to roll out this year, it has not impacted the admission season for the college.

The college has witnessed a rise in the number of applica-

tions, despite increasing the attendance mandate of classes. Ramchandani further informed. There is also a surge in applications for second-year and third-year courses.

The college is currently witnessing five times more applications for admissions than their current seat capacity for

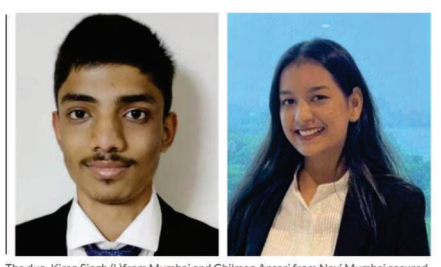
courses like Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com), Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS) and Bachelor of Accounting and Finance among others. "We have an intake capacity of 1000 students but we are receiving at least 4,000 applications for the B.Com course," she added.

"There are some colleges which are very strict regarding their attendance and require the students to fill certain minimum attendance criteria, but we are a little lenient on that front even now," Ramchandani highlighted.

The admission season is currently ongoing and the college has released merit lists for admission to its degree courses, the cutoff for which went as high as 90% for B.Com in the first merit list.

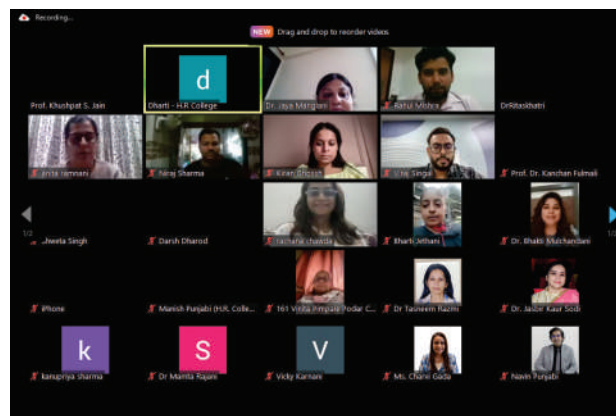

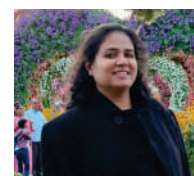

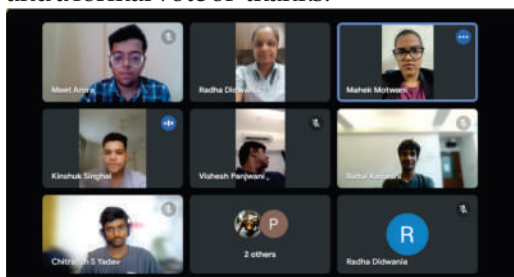


## NGO Visit in Collaboration with Robin Hood Army

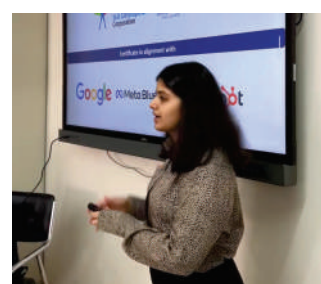

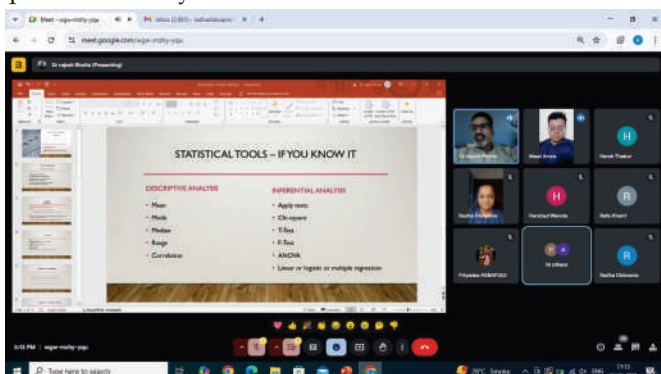
## Black Book Masterclass

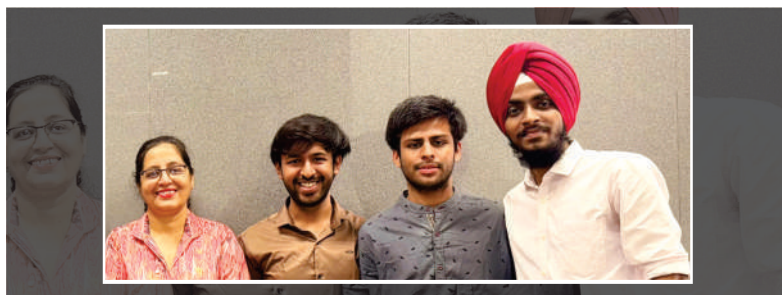


# Special Cell

Conducted by Rashmeet Singh and Mohak Gianani, the initiative provided a safe space for students to share their difficulties related to academics, social interactions, and emotional wellbeing. Through structured discussions, key issues such as difficulty in understanding complex subjects, examination anxiety, social barriers, and a lack of awareness among peers and faculty were identified. Additionally, the need for assistive technologies and counseling support was highlighted as crucial for improving their learning experience. Many students also expressed concerns about the pressure of deadlines, difficulty in keeping up with lectures, and the stigma associated with LD, which often prevents them from seeking help. To address these challenges, several solutions were proposed, including academic accommodations such as extended exam durations and simplified study materials, and awareness campaigns targeted at faculty and peers. Enhancing access to assistive learning tools and establishing regular counseling sessions were also recommended to ensure comprehensive support for LD students. Furthermore, it was suggested that peer support groups be formed to create a sense of belonging and encourage knowledge sharing among students facing similar challenges. Organizing workshops on effective study techniques and time management strategies could also help these students navigate their academic responsibilities more efficiently. This initiative successfully shed light on the struggles faced by LD students and will contribute towards creating a more inclusive and supportive academic environment at HR College – ensuring that every student receives the resources and encouragement needed to succeed.

## Bridge Course - Accounts

January 29–30, 2025

The Bridge Course in Accounts aimed to strengthen students' fundamentals in accounting before their regular coursework. On the first day, Prof. Prachi Ahuja introduced key concepts such as journal entries, ledger postings, and trial balances through interactive exercises. 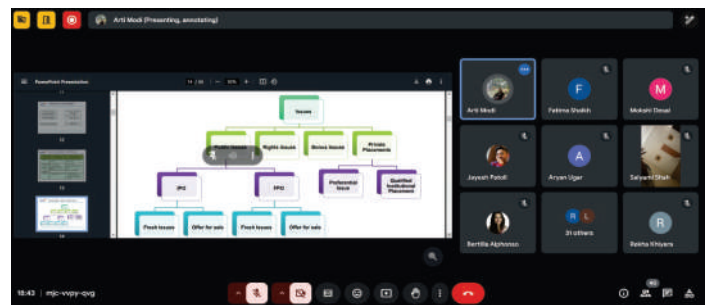

The BMS Committee of HR College organized a 3-day industrial visit to Daman and Silvassa for 50 students.

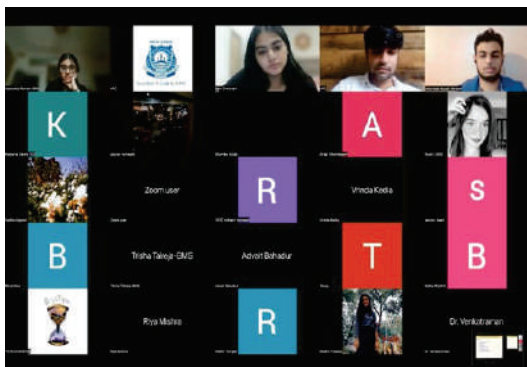

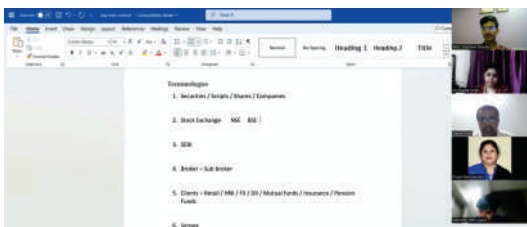
## 30-Hour Certification Course on Python & Derivatives

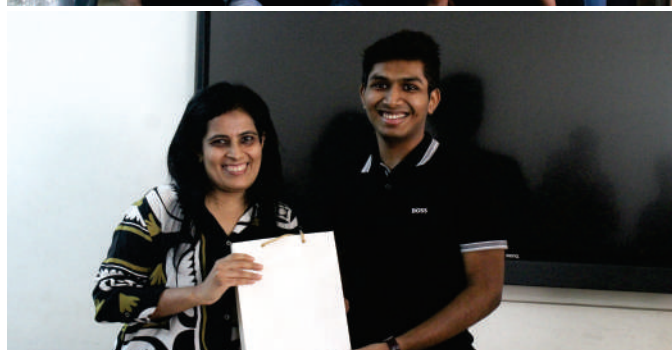
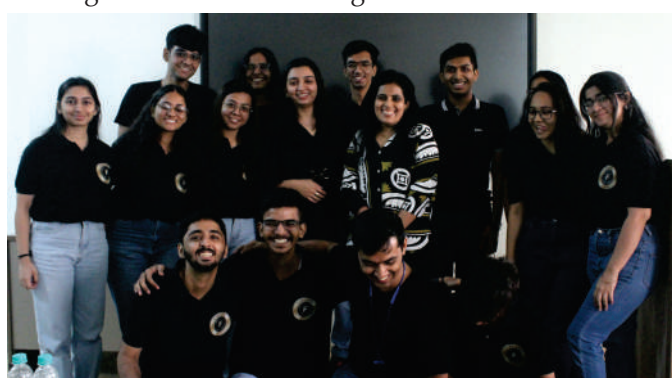
## Finquest 2025: Quizzer's Edge

July 23, 2024

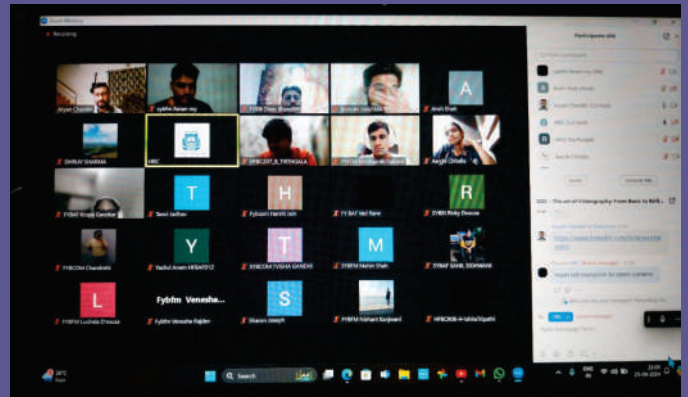

September 19-20, 2024 Attendees: 40

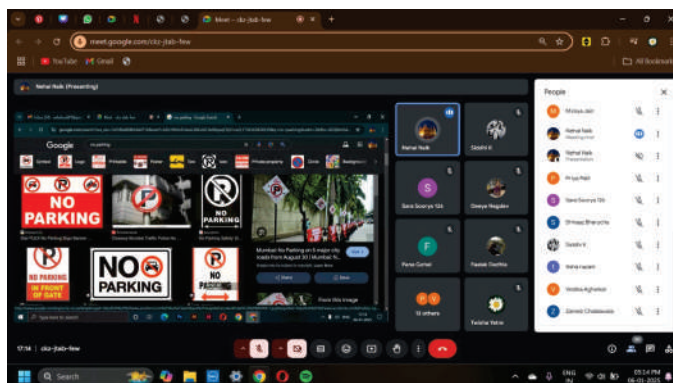

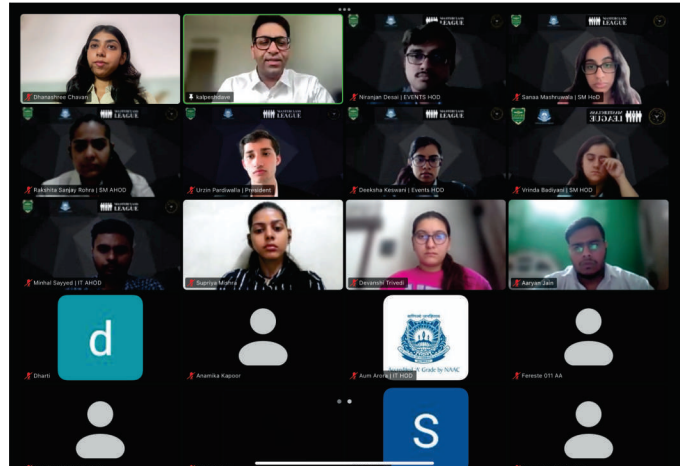


## Masterclass League - Season 4 Finale - Economic Trends and its Impact on Wealth Management

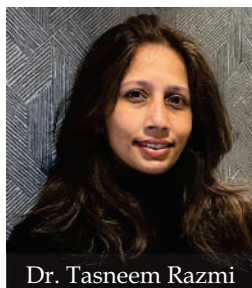

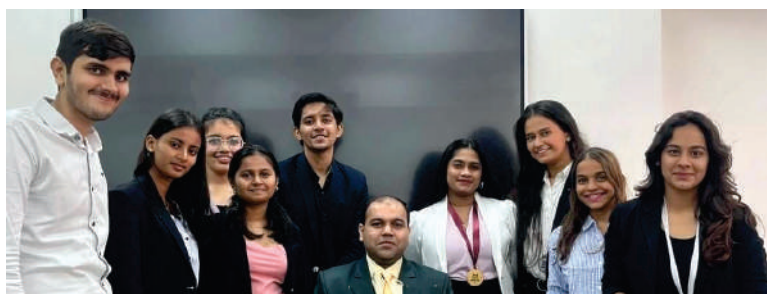


# Yuva Tourism Club - Degree

## World Environmental Day

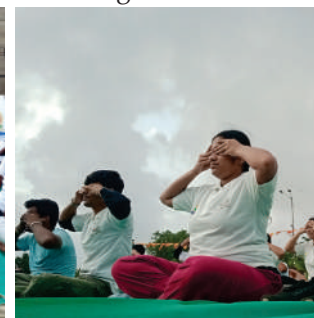

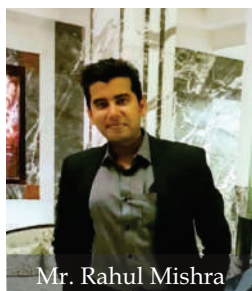

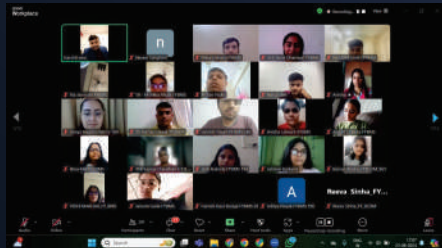
# CERTIFICATE COURSES

The Growth, Development, and Change

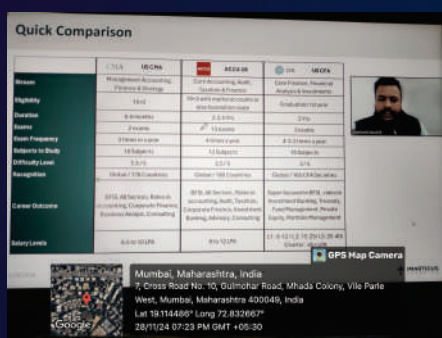

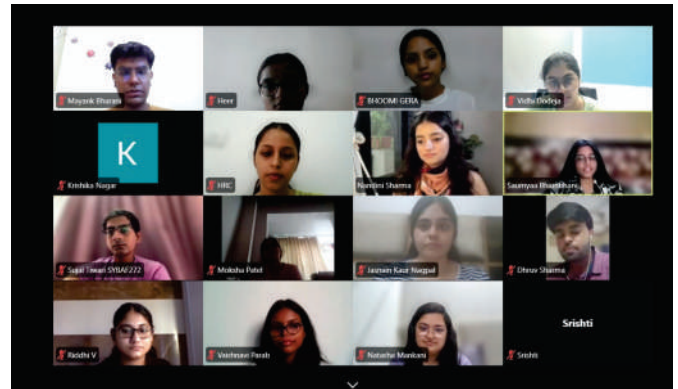


## Interview Preparation, LinkedIn & Resume Building Webinar

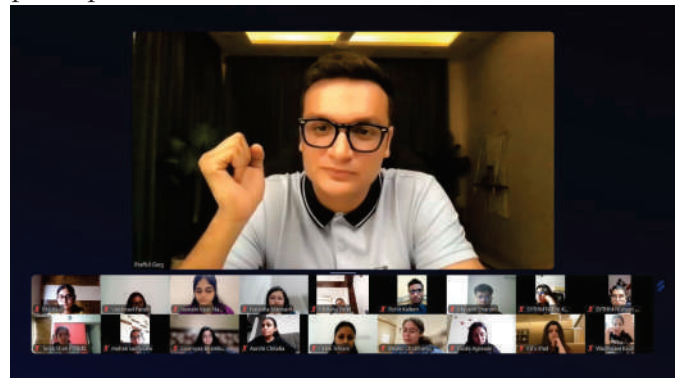

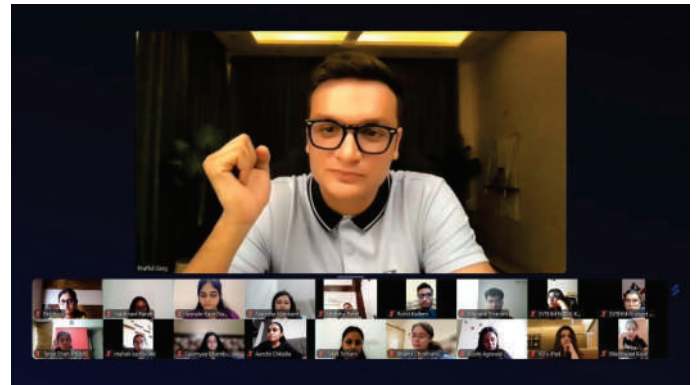
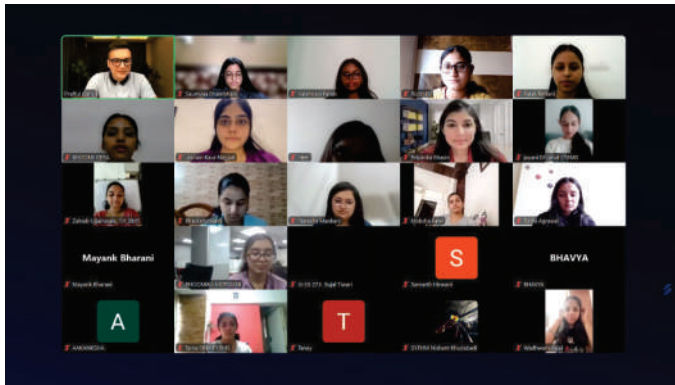
## Digital Marketing Webinar

## IGNITE Entrepreneurship Masterclass

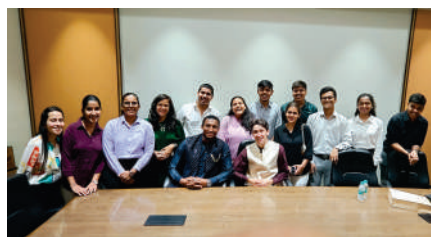

August 13, 2024 Attendees: 240

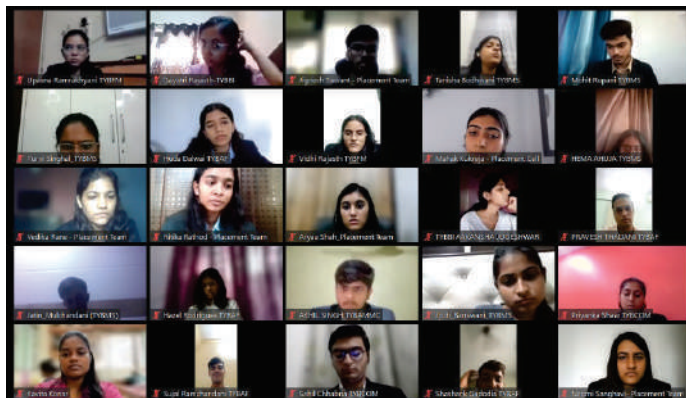

August 16, 2024 Attendees: 273

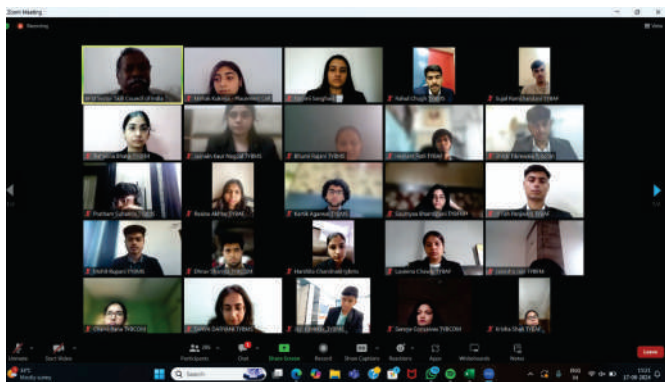

August 17, 2024 Attendees: 292

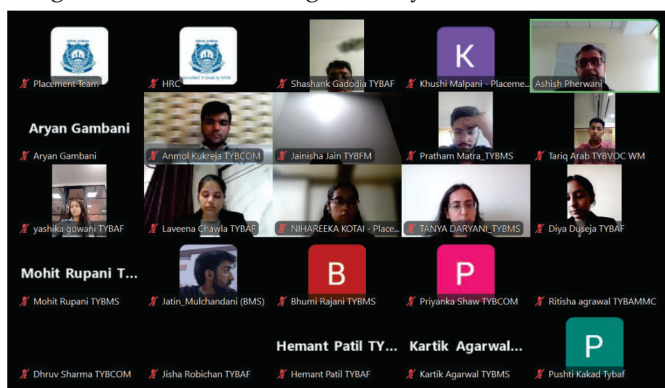

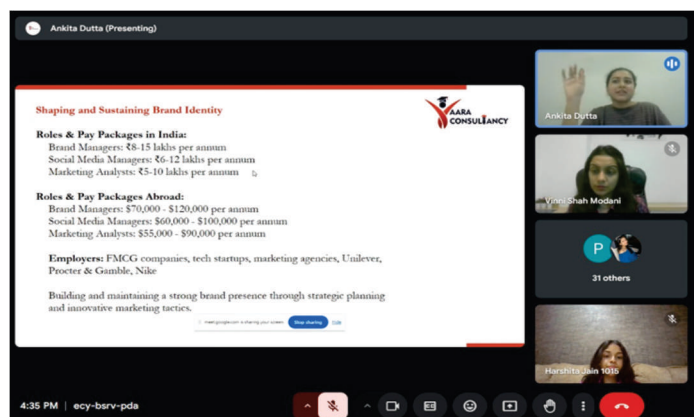
## Journalise Your Journey In Journalism and Mass Media"

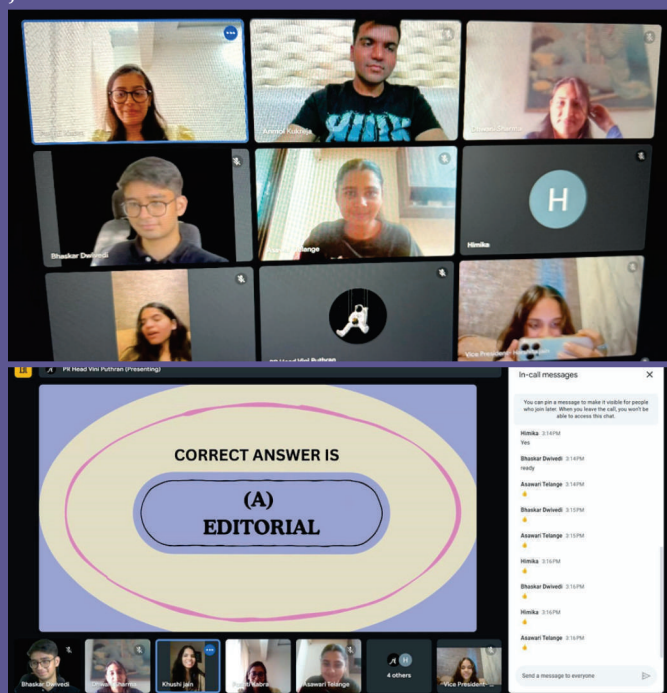




## Journalism Jamboree Quiz

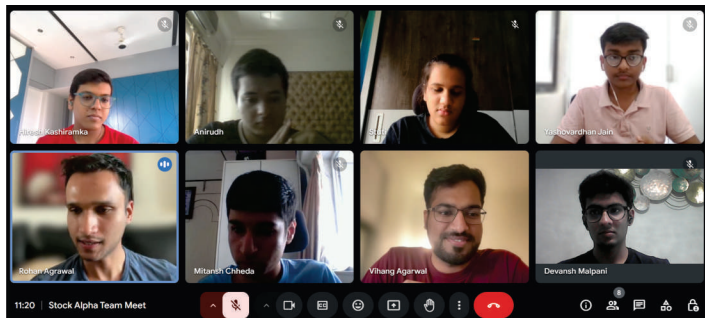

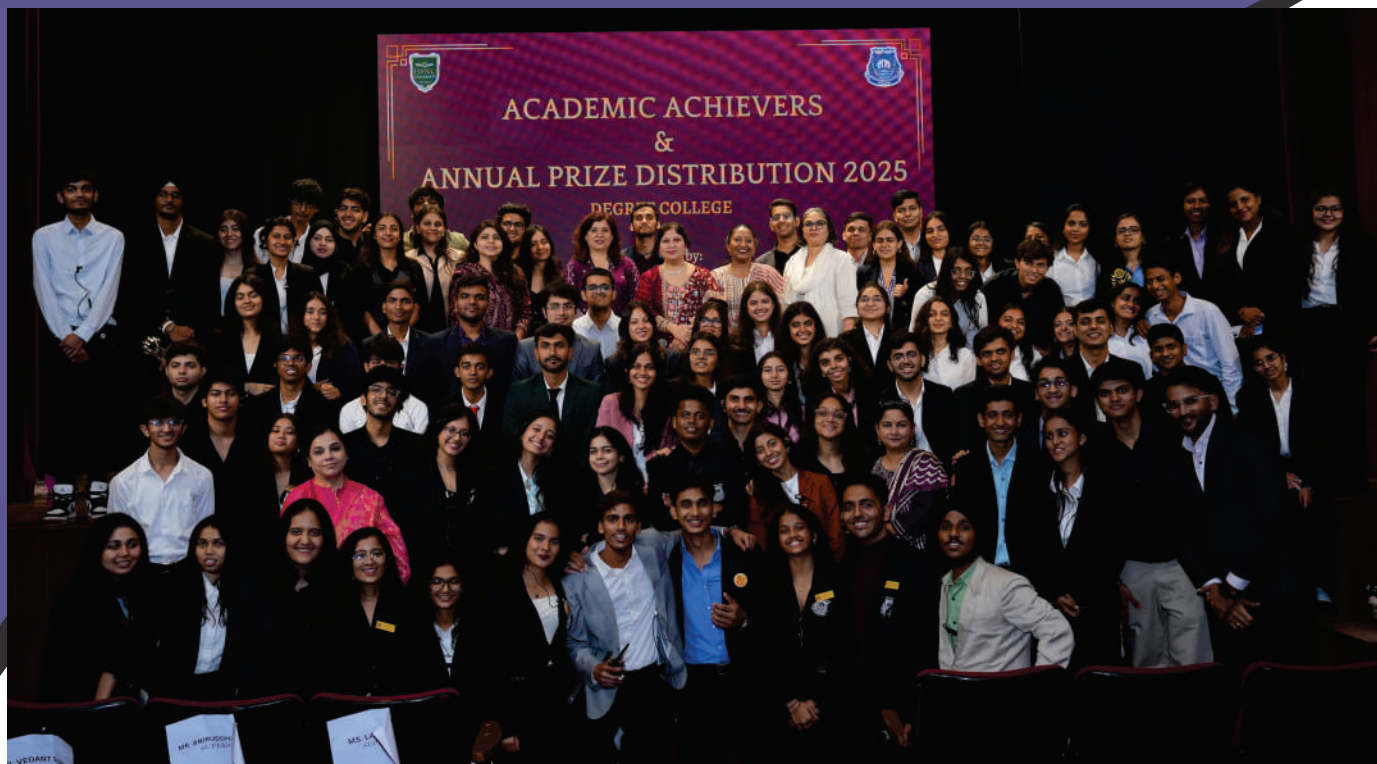
## From Stumbles to Speeches

August 21-22, 2024 Attendees: 600

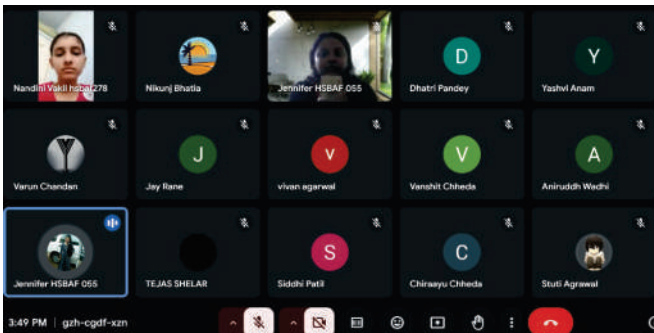

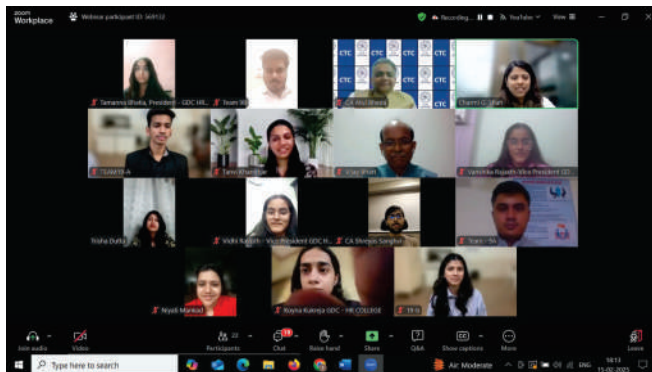




## 8th Dastur National Debate Competition

July 15, 2024 Attendees: 45

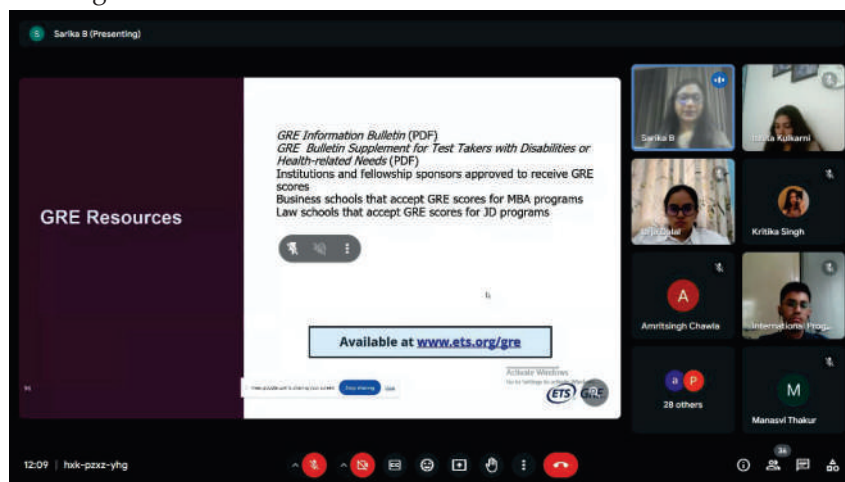

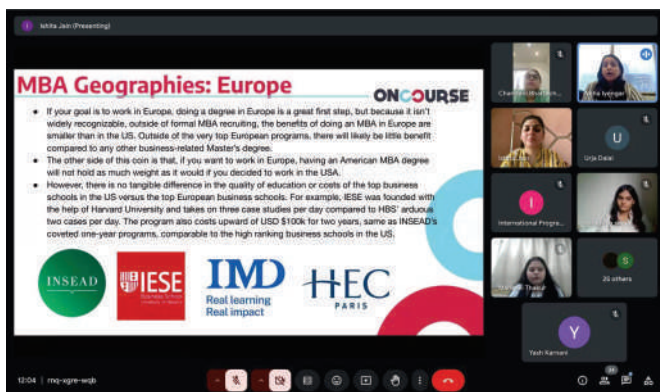

July 18, 2024 Attendees: 34

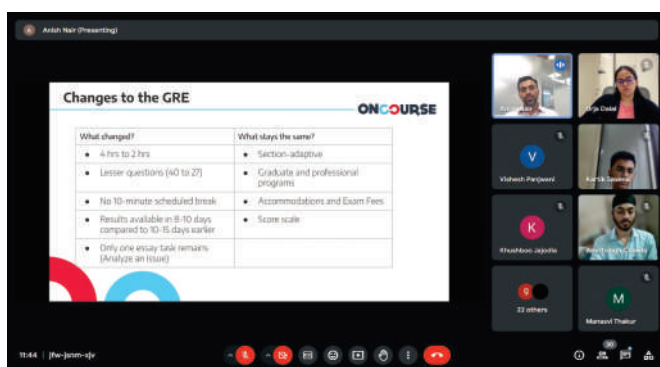

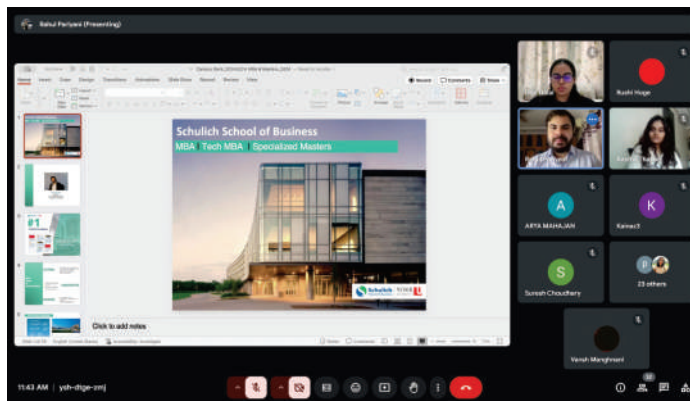

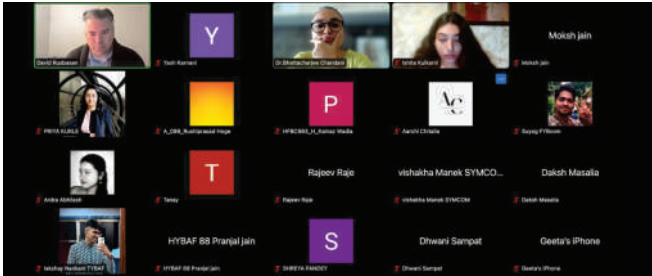
### Organizational Psychology Session

Various pricing techniques like cost-plus, market-based, and value-based were discussed. The evolution of the hospitality industry, the differences between chain and independent hotels, and challenges faced by the sector were explored. Recent trends were highlighted, followed by an engaging Q&A session, concluding the informative discussion.



## The Interface of Economics, Econometrics, and Data Science

December 9, 2024 Attendees: 51

The International Programmes Committee of H.R. College of Commerce and Economics, welcomed Dr. Dr. Peter Postl, Professor of Economics at UCL for a session, titled "The Interface of Economics, Econometrics, and Data Science." Dr. Peter Postl, delivered a thought-provoking lecture exploring the intersection of economics, econometrics, and data science. He illustrated economic principles using eBay's auction model and discussed their application in tech. He emphasized the future of economics, integrating AI and sustainability, and highlighted the evolving role of economists as data scientists using tools like Python. Dr. Peter contrasted econometrics' focus on causality with data science's predictive capabilities, highlighting their combined power to solve real-world challenges. The session ended with an engaging Q&A, deepening attendees' understanding of these dynamic fields.





## SOP Writing Workshop

January 20, 2025 Attendees: 49

Ms. Palak Behl, from King's College, London visited H.R College. During the session, she provided a concise overview of the Statement of Purpose (SOP) and emphasized the need to tailor it according to the requirements of each college or university being applied to. She advised against using AI tools like ChatGPT for SOP writing, stressing the importance of originality and personal reflection in crafting an impactful SOP. The speaker also laid emphasis on how important it is to have a strong statement of purpose as it helps the university understand more about the student, their goals and achievements. A key takeaway from her talk was the emphasis on focusing on the "why" behind one's academic and career choices. Applicants should clearly articulate their reasons for choosing a specific programme, university, or country, as well as how their past experiences align with their future aspirations. Ms. Palak also mentioned how important it is to understand the educational differences between different countries like the United Kingdom and The United States of America. The first session concluded with a round of Q&A and a formal vote of thanks.



## Public Finance and Economics

January 21, 2025 Attendees: 87

The International Programs Committee of H.R. College of Commerce and Economics hosted a masterclass on Public Finance and Economics in collaboration with the University of Bath, United Kingdom. 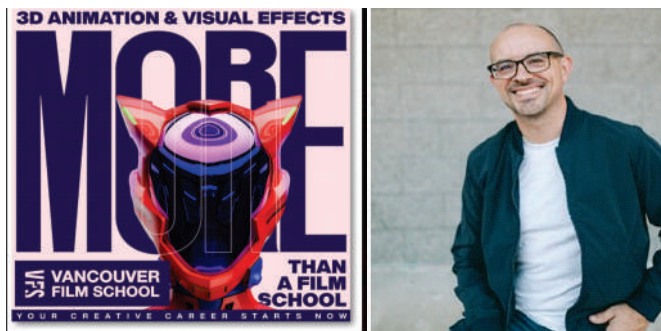




### 3D Animation Masterclass

## Online Webinar on PCOS, Menstrual Health & STDs

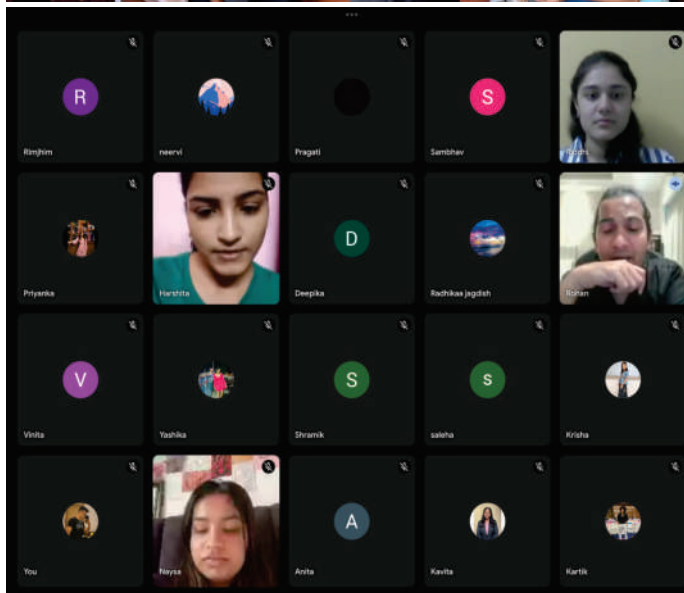
December 23, 2024 Attendees: 20

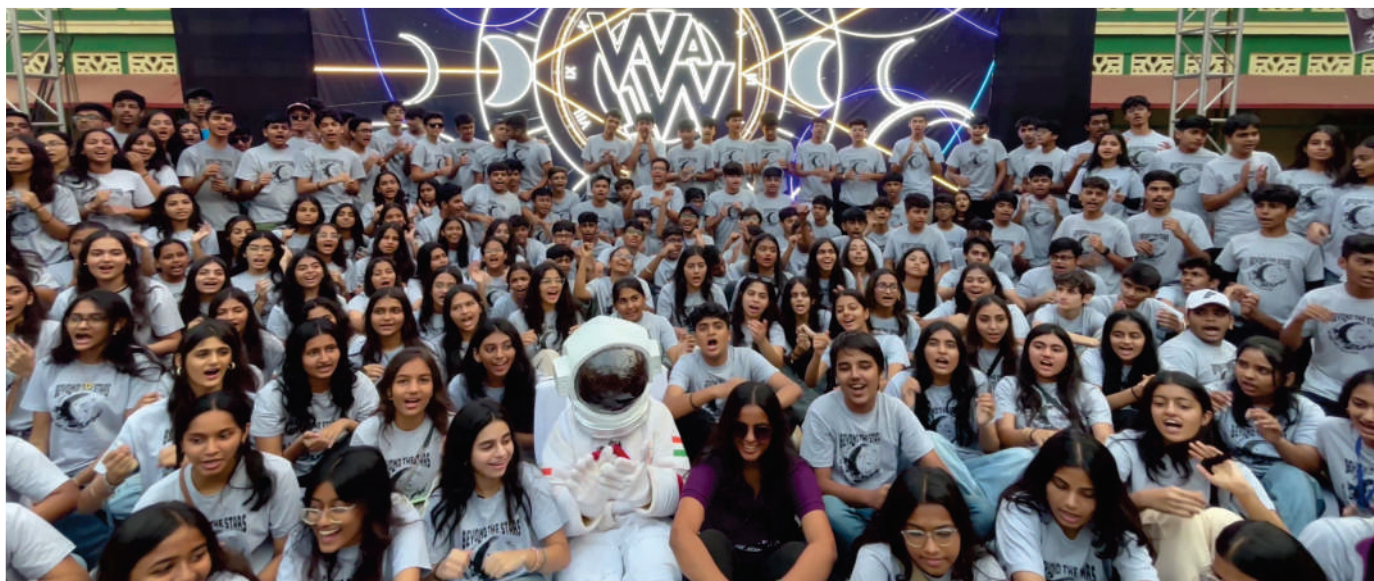
## Fiesta

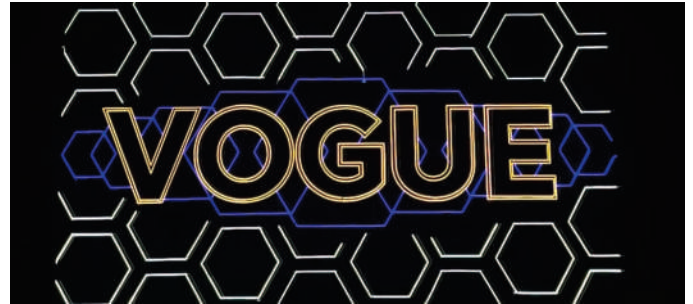


## Vogue

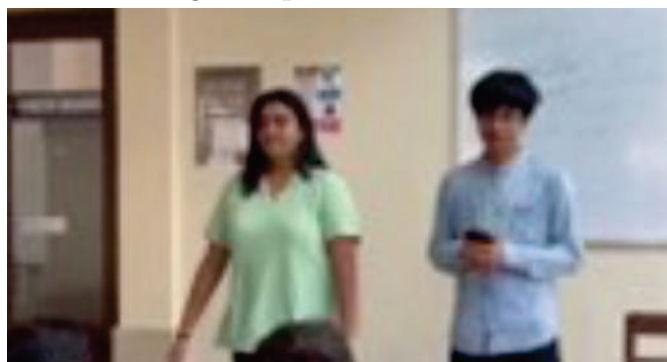




## Mock Stock

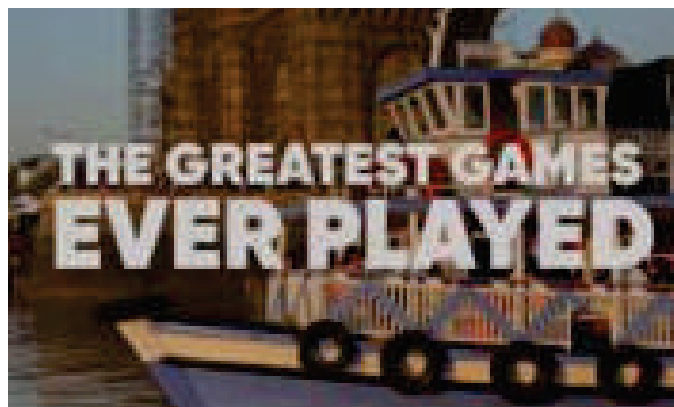


## The Greatest Games Ever Played

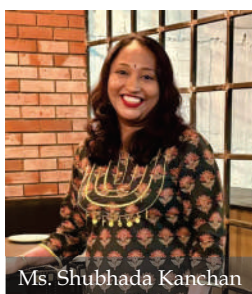

March 1, 2025 Attendees: 1200

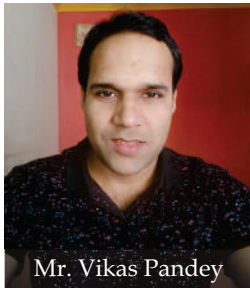

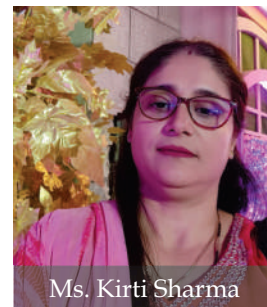


# General Events & Management Society

December 6th to 8th, 2024

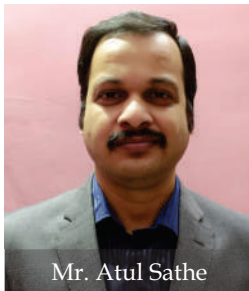

March 6, 2025 Attendees: 200

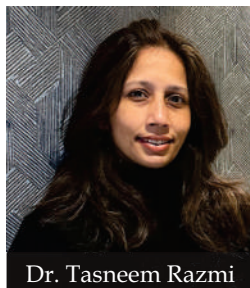

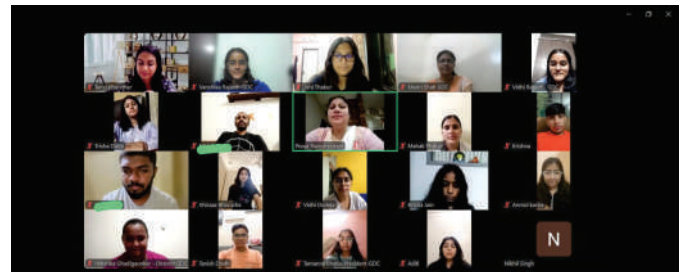


## The Art of Videography

awarded certificates, adding value to their professional pursuits in media and content creation. The program was a resounding success, and GDC looks forward to launching more such skill-building initiatives.

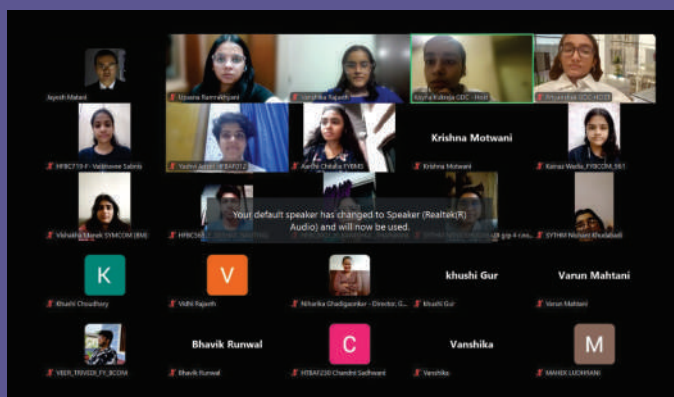


## Risk It Right: Mastering the Entrepreneur's Mindset

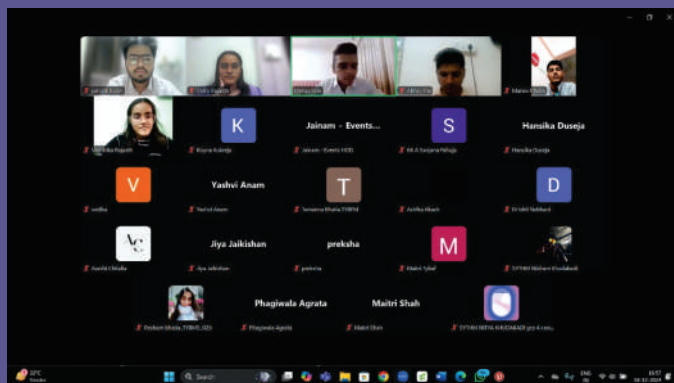




## Navigating Tough Talks:

January 13-15, 2025 Attendees: 623

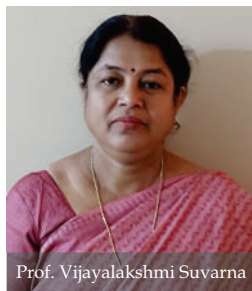

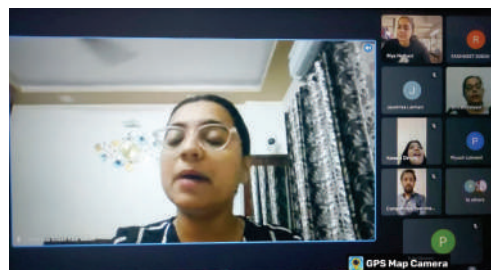


## Webinar on CLAT

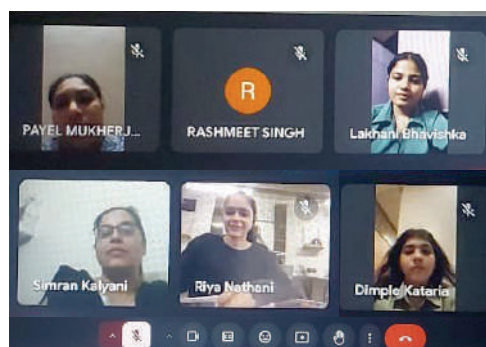

February 8, 2025

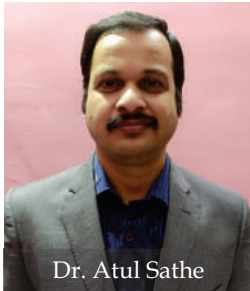

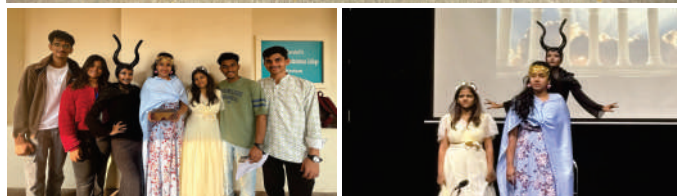

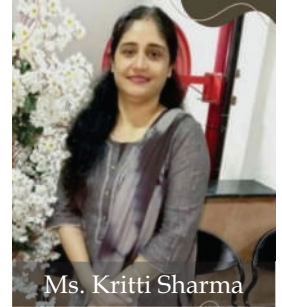


# Sindhi Society

October 5, 2024 Attendees: 150

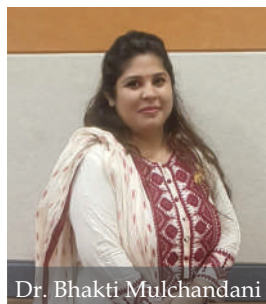

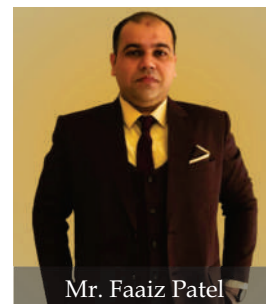


# Parents' Connect Club

February 2, 2025

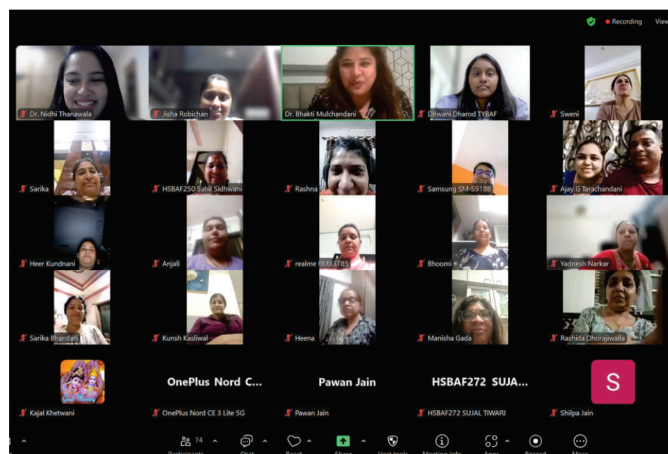

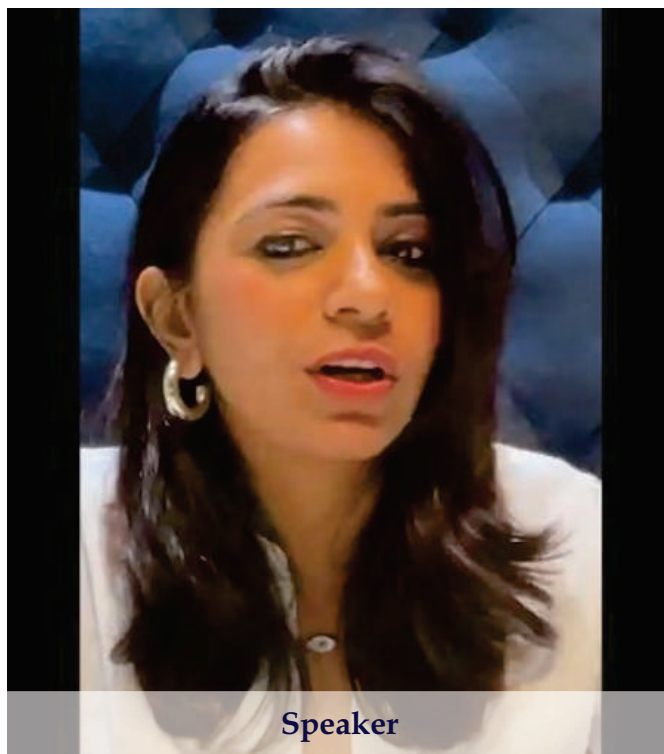
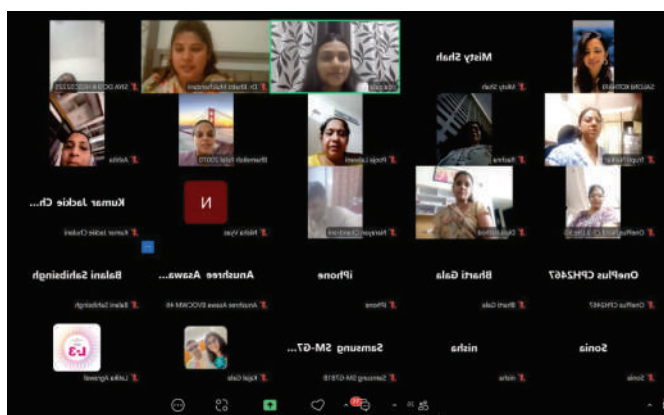




## Reset Your Plate, Reset Your Mind

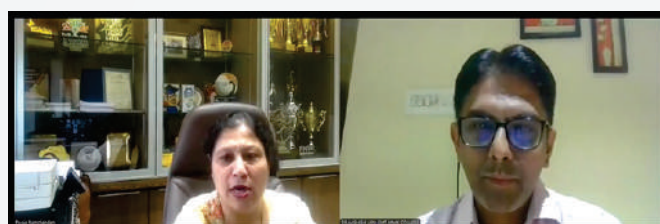
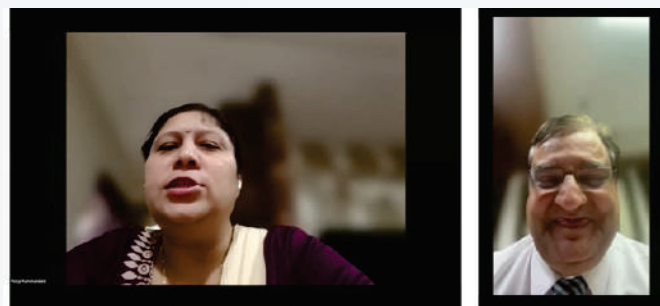
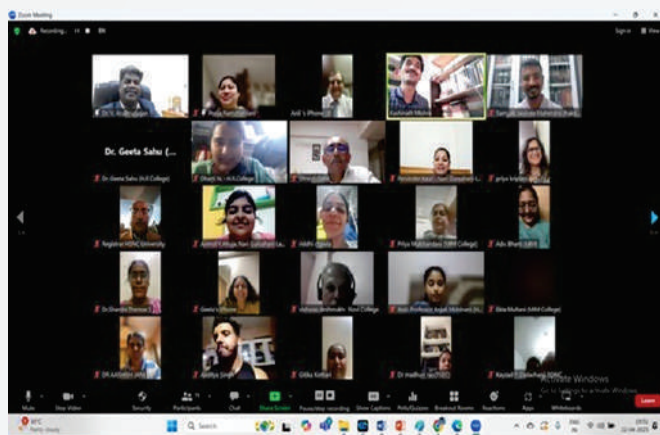
## Webinar on 'Grant Proposal Writing'

The session encouraged interdisciplinary collaboration and offered practical guidance on proposal writing, significantly contributing to the faculty's capacity to pursue funded research.

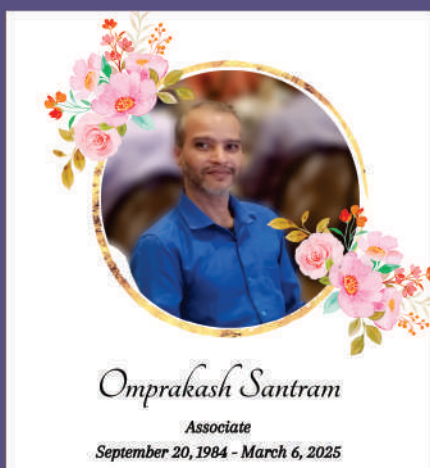






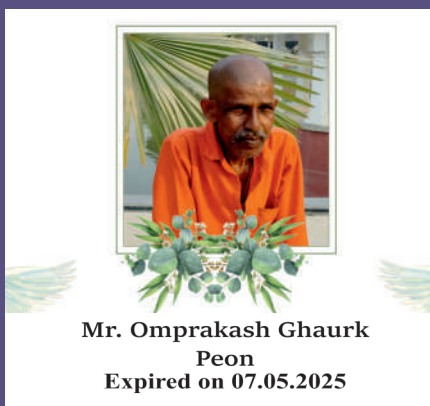
